**16. Please provide a description of programs relating specifically to the humanities, including grant or other budget allocations.**

**The Women of Plums**

The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities presented The Women of Plums, a theatrical adaptation of the prize-winning book by the DC Poet Laureate Dolores Kendrick. The Women of Plums featured poems written in the voices of slave women who relate lives of appalling deprivation in lyrical monologues by local artists, Tamela Aldridge, Vera Oyé Ya Anna, Jazmine Robinson and Gaelyn Smith. Dance and music performances were provided by Capitol Movement, NeWorks Productions, Kendall Isadore, Rogiérs and a live canvas painting by Jay Coleman. The Women of Plums attracted over one thousand attendees at the Historic Lincoln Theatre on Thursday, July 21, 2016.

**Poetry Out Loud**

On March 15, 2016, The Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) hosted the 11<sup>th</sup> annual Poetry Out Loud District finals in the sound studios at the DC Office of Cable Television, Film, Music, and Entertainment. Poetry Out Loud, a joint program of the National Endowment for the Arts and The Poetry Foundation, is a national competition that seeks to foster the next generation of literary readers by capitalizing on the latest trends in poetry-recitation and performance. The program builds on the resurgence of the oral art form of poetry, as seen in the slam poetry and spoken word movements. Poetry Out Loud invites these dynamic aspects into the classroom, where teachers engage students through classroom memorization, performances and competition. Through Poetry Out Loud, students master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage. Spoken word artist and performer, Paige Hernandez, was the emcee for the evening.

The District competition featured performances by the award-winning Split this Rock Youth Slam Team and Regie Cabico, a local poet, teaching artist and spoken word artist. Prior to the event, Mr. Cabico and fellow teaching artist Naomi Ayala conducted in-school poetry workshops designed to both prepare students for the competition and encourage interest in poetry.

Nine high school students from DC public, charter, and private schools competed at the finals. They represented Basis Public Charter School, Benjamin Banneker Academic High School, Capital City Public Charter School, Columbia Heights Education Campus, EL Haynes High School, McKinley Technology High School, St. Anselm's Abbey School, The SEED School of Washington, and Washington Latin Public Charter School. Erica Jones, a 12<sup>th</sup> grader at McKinley Technology High School, went on to represent the District of Columbia at the 2016 Poetry Out Loud National Championship held at the George Washington University's Lisner Auditorium on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2016.

The 12<sup>th</sup> annual Poetry Out Loud competition will take place March 8, 2017 in the sound studio of the Office of Cable Television, Film, Music, and Entertainment. The performance will be edited and shown on cable television at a later date. Students from thirteen local high schools will participate. Teaching artists will once again work with students in preparation for their participation in their school, District, and national finals.

### **The Larry Neal Writers' Awards**

Since 1982, the DC Commission on the Arts Humanities (CAH) has hosted The Larry Neal Writers' Competition, an undertaking that commemorates the artistic legacy and vision of Larry Neal, the renowned author, academic and former Executive Director of the Commission. The competition is open to any District of Columbia adult, child, or youth resident, from 4<sup>th</sup> grade through adult. Writers may apply in the areas of poetry, fiction, and dramatic writing. Each year, the competition culminates with an awards ceremony.

The 33<sup>rd</sup> Larry Neal Awards ceremony was held on June 9th in the gallery of the DC government building in which CAH offices are located, 200 I Street SE. Thomas Sayers Ellis was the emcee for the evening and presenters included: Toni Ford (CAH Commissioner), Dolores Kendrick (Poet Laureate), Tara Libert (Free Minds Book Club), Louis Hicks (Humanities Council of DC), Laura Escoli (Young Playwrights' Theatre, and Denise Rolark Barnes (The Washington Informer).

### **Celebrating the Creative Spark!**

The DC Commission on the Arts Humanities (CAH) celebrated National Arts in Education Month in March 2016 with a series of 126 workshops led by teaching artists and arts and humanities organizations in schools, libraries, and community arts venues across all eight wards of the city. These workshops focused on the generative or process-driven nature of the work done in the arts and humanities that help young people build the essential "habits of mind" and "21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills" that ensure their future success. Workshops were implemented for pre-school to high school students and included: creative writing, storytelling, media, fashion design, music, theatre, dance, improvisation, and visual arts.

CAH has embarked on planning for its third year of Creative Spark! programming and will place approximately 135 workshops in schools across the District.

### **Partnership with the Humanities Council of Washington, DC**

Each year, the CAH partners with HumanitiesDC to support general operating costs and four separate public humanities programs: the DC Community Heritage Project (DCCHP), the DC Digital Museum, the Soul of the City youth leadership program, and the Humanitini series for young professionals. In FY16, the CAH's partnership agreement and sub grant awards supported 40 grant awards, and the continued digitization and documentation of interpretive and educational materials created through HumanitiesDC grants. The grant programs supported are: Open Public Humanities Grants, Soul of the City Grants, DC Community Heritage Project Grants, and Who's a Washingtonian.

**17. You previously had mentioned needing \$34.7 million in FY16 to fund all the requests received for grants. What is the amount for FY 17?**

For FY17 to date, the DC Commission on Arts and Humanities (CAH) has received \$30,012,911 in requests. However, CAH has \$4,981,741 in remaining FY17 grant funds. Three FY17 grant programs are currently open for applications: Arts Education Experiences, Public Art Building Communities, and Projects, Events, and Festivals. Based on our projections, CAH anticipates a total of \$42,163,377 in FY17 requests.

**19. Please provide a status update on the Commission's geospatial, web-based, interactive mapping program, the Comprehensive Environmental Survey of Arts Resources (CESAR). Please discuss successes, lessons learned, and future plans.**

The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) released the Agency's geospatial, web-based, interactive mapping program, the **Comprehensive Environmental Survey of Arts Resources (CESAR)**, on May 22, 2015 as part of Mayor Bowser's *InnoMAYtion Month* initiative.

Since that time, CAH has utilized the mapping tool to better understand the landscape of arts and cultural resources in the District of Columbia and to examine how grant award funds are distributed across all eight wards. Ultimately, CESAR is a graphics-based tool for:

- Policy analysis and development, assessing the historical uses of CAH investments across the District and informing future policy and data-driven decision making.
- Resource and information for our key constituencies and partners.
- Comprehensive overview of the arts and humanities resources across the District.

An updated version of CESAR is currently being piloted, which will aggregate information regarding the density and clusters of nonprofit arts and humanities organizations from FY13 through FY17. CESAR was originally designed to serve as a database compiling the locations of individual artists who received grants through CAH's Artist Fellowship Program. Upon further investigation with the community, it has been decided not to disclose the addresses of these individuals to address privacy concerns.

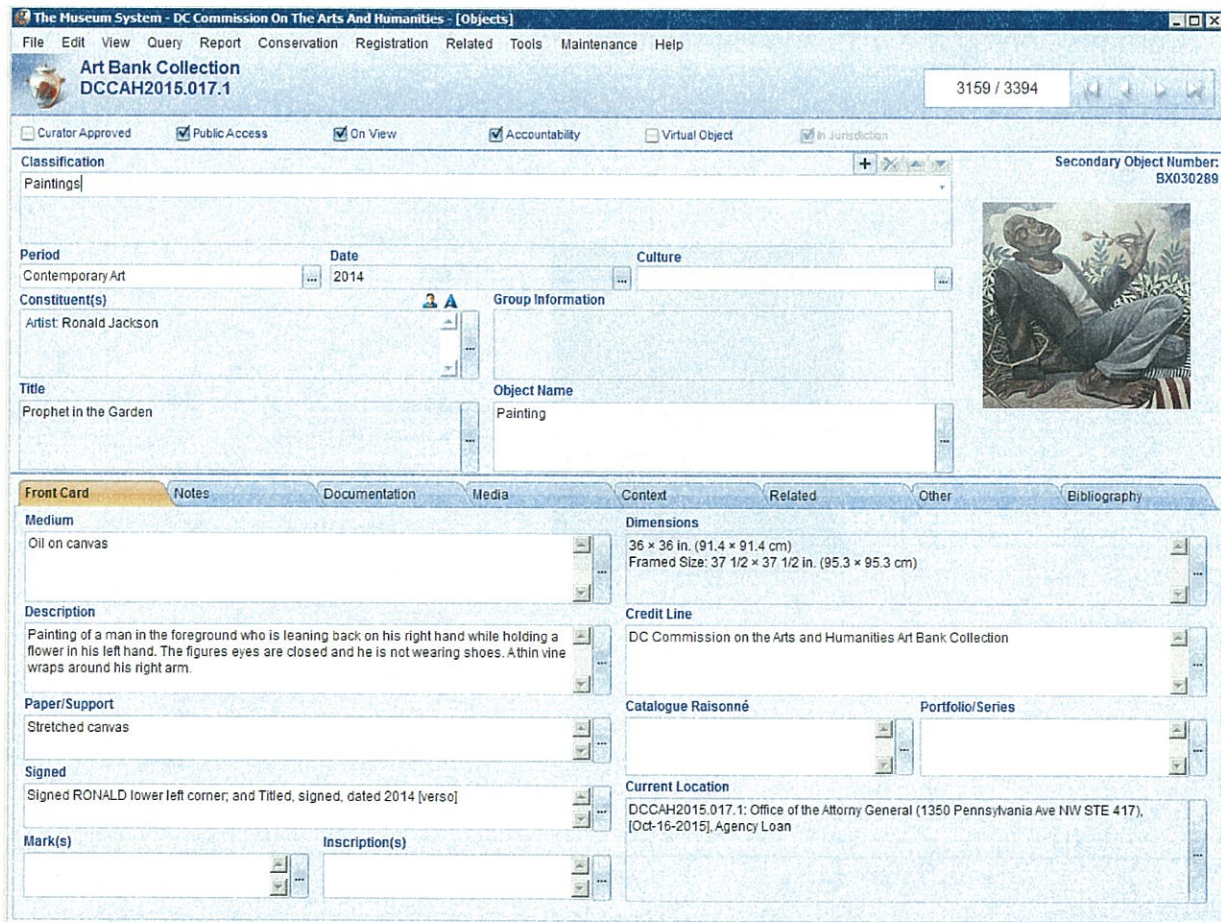
Moving forward, the Agency will continue to use CESAR as a data collection tool, providing updated information on recent grant awards. As more information populates the system, CESAR will have greater capabilities to map stories of arts and humanities successes around the District and provide historical context.



**20. You previously mentioned installing and implementing usage of The Museum Software (TMS), a content management system to better catalog and track the location of the art collections. Please provide a status update. Have all Public Art Collection and Art Bank Collection catalog records been entered and finalized?**

CAH has been implementing the TMS system for the collection since its procurement of the software in FY15. During this time staff has transferred and entered every catalog record into the system. To date CAH has finalized 90% of those records. Records that are not fully finalized are older artworks that have missing fields such as size, medium, signature location or missing an image. We are in the last stage of cataloging the additional information to make our records as robust and complete as possible. All records in TMS are a living account of our agencies collection and project history that will continue to be updated and expanded as information is gathered.

TMS currently houses the entire collection with over 3,450 catalog records. The records make up the current Art Bank and Public Art Collection including public artworks no longer in public space. These artworks were decommissioned from either redevelopment of the site, works created only as temporary installations or these that have been removed for public safety. Below is a screenshots to demonstrate the appearance of a catalog record within TMS.



Furthermore, in May 2016, CAH launched the website through TMS showcasing the entire collection accessible with current locations. When viewing the website, visitors can find more information about the collections, where to find artworks and become engaged by creating a login account with *My Collections*. By creating a login, visitors can save their favorite artworks and organize works into groups through their own art curated collection folders. All this can be easily shared through social media. Since it launched, the website has received over 900 visitors with 12,500 page views.

CAH is now focusing on broadening each catalog record by including artist statements and artist biographies for each artwork. These artist statements and biographies will also be available online. **21. Please provide a description of and status update on the DC Heritage Grant Program.**

In January 2016, CAH launched the FY17 Heritage Grant Program (HGP). HGP offers general operating support to non-profit arts, humanities and arts education organizations that focus on the following areas: dance, design, folk and traditional arts, literature, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts. HGP applicants must demonstrate total activities and/or services are concentrated on and devoted to the arts and humanities and/or arts education with at least seven (7) years of arts and/or humanities activities and/or arts education in the District of Columbia. Eligible organizations must have designated tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) by the United States Internal Revenue Code dated on or before January 1, 2009.

The goals of the FY17 Heritage Grant Program are to provide access to high-quality arts and humanities experiences and/or arts education for all District of Columbia residents; stimulate the creative economy through investments in the stabilization and advancement of established arts, humanities and/or arts education organizations; and, recognize arts, humanities and arts education organizations who have defined DC's heritage through a history of consistent, broad and exemplary programming.

The establishment of the FY17 Heritage Grant program has provided:

- A funding designation that is valuable for the community to employ. FY17 Heritage Grant Program status has served a seal of approval for the organizations funded. This designation has helped them leverage opportunities with other funders and partners.
- A program that supports long-term sustainability as it incentivizes growth through risk and innovation. Unrestricted funds allow organizations the flexibility to explore innovative new initiatives and respond to programmatic opportunities without being tied to the restraints of projects funding.
- Rapid turnaround on notification. CAH notified FY17 Heritage Grant Program recipients of their status via an "Intent to Fund" letter in April 2016. This allowed organizations time and space to plan for their FY17 budgets.
- A program that does not reward those who have always had access to resources. Organizations are eligible based on their mission and time in operation, rather than budget or staff size.
- Increased credibility of CAH-supported organizations while increasing credibility of CAH for the intentionality of its program design. The establishment of the program was in direct response to the needs of the community.
- A baseline for exploration of multi-year funding. The FY17 Heritage Grant Program recipients are arts, humanities and arts education organizations who demonstrate sustainability in addition to assessed field-building initiatives and outstanding programs. CAH will continue to monitor the success of this program and these recipients through deep connection with the participating organizations including reporting on substantial operational triggers that would otherwise prohibit multi-year support. CAH believes this program and its more rigorous reporting modules that result in better service for its participating organizations will ensure tax-payer investments can be responsibly managed across multiple years should the Agency be given the opportunity to do so.

In January 2017, CAH launched the FY18 cycle of the Heritage Grant program. For FY18 CAH has renamed the grant General Operating Support (GOS) program. The General Operating Support program will continue to offer general operating support funding to non-profit arts,

humanities and arts education organizations. Organizations with a 501(c)3 letter dated on or before 1/1/2010 with seven (7) years of programming in DC are deemed "Heritage organizations" by CAH. As such these organizations are eligible to receive funding for up to 35% of FY16 cash expenses.

Based on feedback from the community, CAH opened the program to include arts, humanities and arts education organizations younger than 7 years. Organizations with a 501(c)3 letter dated on or before 1/1/2016 with at least one (1) year of programming in DC prior to the time of application are deemed "Horizon organizations" by CAH. As such these are organizations are eligible to receive funding for up to 30% of FY16 cash expenses.

Additionally, the FY18 General Operating Support program will be open to Service Organizations. Service organizations are those whose primary mission is to provide specialized support to people or institutions within the arts and humanities through functions like networking, professional development, communication, convening, and various technical or managerial supports. Organizations such as the DC Arts and Humanities Education Collaborative Inc, Humanities DC and Washington Area Lawyers for the Arts will be eligible to apply for grant funding in the Service Organization cohort of the FY18 General Operating Support Program. Organizations with a 501(c)3 letter dated on or before 1/1/2016 and dedicated to providing technical assistance and support services to DC arts and humanities practitioners are deemed "Service organizations." As such these organizations are eligible to receive funding for up to 25% of FY16 cash expenses across all CAH grant programs.

**22. Please provide an update of the five focus areas identified in your Agency Strategic Plan.**

The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) released the Agency's revised Strategic Plan in September of 2015. The Agency is implementing programs and policies across the six focus areas of the plan, which include: Grant Making, Arts Education, Building Communities, Policy Leadership, Equity and Access, and Public Art.

Grant Making highlights include an evaluation of the efficiency of program delivery, strengthening the impact of grant programs and the establishment of the Heritage Grant Program as a means to stabilize year-to-year grant amounts for nonprofit organizations. The Heritage Grant Program was piloted in the winter of 2016 to prioritize and restrict general operating support for core constituents with at least seven (7) years of arts and/or humanities activities and/or arts education in the District of Columbia. These organizations make significant contributions to the creative economy. Organizations receiving funding through Heritage were made aware of their award designation earlier than in previous years, allowing for these entities to have a greater financial outlook on FY17. In its pilot year, 74 grantees received \$5.1 million in crucial general operating funding.

For FY18, CAH is expanding its general operating support beyond the Heritage cohort, to now include Horizon organizations that are emerging arts and humanities nonprofits with at least one year of experience in the field. A new Service Organization cohort has been created to allow entities whose sole function is to provide specialized services such as networking, professional development and technical support to the arts and humanities community. This is the first time that service organizations have been eligible for funding in a competitive application process.

Arts Education is a longstanding priority of CAH. In November 2016, the Agency awarded funds for its Field Trip Experiences Grant Program, which aimed to provide opportunities for nonprofit arts and humanities organizations to provide field trips to students in all DC public and chartered schools. A total of 14 organizations received \$538,350 for this grant program. An additional grant opportunity is currently soliciting applications for Arts Education Experiences aiming at youth in prekindergarten through 21 years of age.

Another new initiative in FY17 was the Spotlight on Arts Education – a symposium featuring panels of locally and nationally recognized speakers. This daylong event was held on November 15, 2016, gathering arts and humanities education focused leaders to discuss trends, priorities and the future direction of the field. Special guest Dr. Myran Parker-Brass served as the keynote speaker. She is the Executive Director for the Arts in the Boston City Public School system, and was able to share the successes and challenges in the arts education landscape that led to creating growth of arts and humanities education for that city.

The Building Communities focus area of the strategic plan codified the work that occurs at CAH on a daily basis. Director Espinoza and his staff regularly engage with members of the community to discuss funding opportunities, relevant programs and methods for ensuring all Agency initiatives are accessible for all District residents. Through the partnership that the Agency has with the DC Office of Planning, specialized community engagement sessions have provided a platform for individuals to voice their ideas related to the creation of the District's first Cultural Plan. Beginning in July and continuing through the end of 2016, CAH was an active participant in the development and implementation of these community sessions. As a result of these conversations, four (4) focus areas have been identified which will further inform the writing of the plan. These areas are Cultural Entrepreneurship, DC Culture, Partnerships and Space.

The Agency continues to work with organizations to express the importance of creative placemaking, which leverages the power of the arts, culture and creativity to serve a community's interest while driving a broader agenda for change, growth and transformation in a way that also builds character and quality of place. CAH continues to examine how it can effect change related to creative placemaking, especially through the Facilities and Buildings Grant Program. This initiative provides funding for organizations with capital needs, from minor HVAC repairs to assistance with a facility purchase.

CAH's work with Policy Leadership has led to the hire of a new staff position – the External Engagement Specialist. This role will work across all departments within the agency to connect deeper into the community, serving as a liaison to ANC's and representing CAH at various stakeholder meetings and events. It is through this position that the Agency will hone its policy leadership across all priority areas.

Equity and Access serves as a major focus for all Agency initiatives. Director Espinoza created I.D.E.A., which is an acronym for Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access. The intent of I.D.E.A. is to ensure that all commissioners and staff are cognizant that each component is to be addressed by the Agency and its grantees. For instance, the Agency recognized that many of its grantees applying for East of the River grant funds have difficulties growing the infrastructure of their organizations and finding funding for programs. As a method for alleviating those concerns, the FY17 East of the River grant funded a larger percentage of these organization's project budgets to ensure that these entities implement robust programming for that region.

The Upstart capacity building program continues to award six (6) nonprofit organizations with consulting services and infrastructure support upwards of \$50,000 each. Grantees of Upstart are mid-sized with at least one staff person, which provides a barrier for smaller and emerging organizations. For FY17, the Agency is developing a new version of Upstart – entitled Lift Off – that will help build the capacity of smaller organizations to better assist with their evolution.

Public Art remains an integral element to CAH's work. Revisions to the Public Art Master Plan are currently underway and will be released in the coming month. This Plan will create a roadmap for future Public Art priorities for the next five years. The Agency

has several Public Art projects currently in various stages of design and fabrication. Most recently, the Zero Street Harassment Public Art Project was completed, in partnership with DDOT's Vision Zero Initiative and Age-Friendly DC. Through a competitive process, two design teams were selected to install interactive public art along the 14<sup>th</sup> Street corridor in an effort to stimulate dialogue surrounding the issue of street harassment.

The Howard Theatre Walk of Fame is in the final stages of planning, with bronze medallions being proposed along 7<sup>th</sup> Street Northwest leading up to the entrance of the historic Howard Theatre. The U.S. Commission of Fine Arts recently approved the project concept from the artist team. Other projects currently in process include the K Street Gateway with Golden Triangle BID, the commission of a bronze statue of Mayor Marion Barry, and the Pepco Substation.



**23. Please provide an update on the Cultural Plan for the city and your involvement in the plan, and its anticipated implementation.**

As a result of the DC Council's Cultural Plan for the District Act of 2015, the DC Office of Planning (OP) was designated as the lead agency responsible for the creation of the District's first Cultural Plan. The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) was designated as a consulting agency, with the DC Office of Cable Television, Music, Film and Entertainment (OCTFME) joining later on to assist with community outreach and plan review. A consultant team led by HR&A with support by buildingcommunityWORKSHOP was selected to conduct research and analysis, coordinate the engagement strategy, lead stakeholder interviews and special events, and synthesize findings into the final plan.

The Cultural Plan will lay out a vision and recommendations on how the government and its partners can build upon, strengthen and invest in the people, places, communities and ideas that define culture in the District. The Plan was introduced to the public in July 2016 with a large event, entitled INTERMISSIONDC, featuring learning and listening stations that allowed attendees to provide feedback on their vision for arts and culture in the city. Over 500 people attended. From this convening, four key areas were identified that articulated the desires and interests of the community: DC Culture, Entrepreneurship, Partnerships and Space.

Following a series of successful interagency conversations with groups such as Humanities DC, further outreach in the community began in October 2016. These sessions occurred in each quadrant of the city with discussions framed around each the four focus areas. Over 300 artists, neighborhood invested individuals and representatives from arts and humanities organizations joined the conversation. Follow-up convenings also occurred with entities such as Arts Action DC as well as youth and arts educators. To date, more than 1,000 stakeholders have participated in Cultural Plan conversations.

Currently, the consulting team is drafting the content of the Cultural Plan for review by OP. OP will then produce a draft plan including strategies for public comment. Several small group discussions are being planned for the coming month, including one that is focused on individual artists. OP also plans to hold a final citywide INTERMISSIONDC event to obtain feedback on the Plan and its recommendations. OP is on track to complete the Plan by the deadline of April 30, 2017.

Per the BSA, a steering committee shall be formed to assist in the implementation of the Plan. The committee shall include representation by various key agencies including DCCA, DMPED and OP and shall track quarterly progress of the Plan's recommendations.





**24. Please provide an update on grants for public art on the issue of street harassment and the need for it to stop.**

CAH, in partnership with Age-Friendly DC and DDOT, has sited two temporary public artworks aimed at curbing instances of street harassment, as part of Mayor Muriel Bowser's Vision Zero initiative. When our public spaces are free of harassment, people walking, rolling, biking and driving are free to make safe decisions on our streets. It was a goal of Age-Friendly DC to work with CAH to raise awareness of public harassment which can force people into situations that are even more dangerous.

Through this collaboration between agencies, two proposals were selected through an open call for submissions. Marshall Moya Design installed a covered walkway outside of the Frank D. Reeves Center at **2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street NW**. **Emzki DC Art Collective** installed a metal and wood version of the District of Columbia flag at the corner of **14<sup>th</sup> and Irving Streets NW**. Both public art projects were opened on January 10 and will run through March 3, 2017.

The projects have received media coverage from ABC News 7, NBC Washington 4, Fox 5, Popville, and WAMU at American University. The projects are both aimed to collect stories and responses on the subject of street harassment. As of February 1, it has been reported by the artists over 600 people have visited the site and interacted with the projects. Data has been collected by 105 participants via text messaging and 320 responded to surveys about street harassment and vehicular safety. On social media the project has been shared and hash tagged via Instagram over 100 times.

Once the project is completed the data will be collected and given to DDOT to analyze how harassment and traffic safety are affecting the city. CAH will also receive a final report and data from the artists to inform our process moving forward in the development of any future projects that may address social issues.





**25. Please provide an update on efforts to promote and preserve Jazz, and other music genres as discussed or as a result of the introduction and hearing held last year on Bill 21-835, the “Jazz Preservation Education Promulgation and Performance Artist Act of 2016”.**

Since the introduction of the “Jazz Preservation, Education, Promulgation and Performance Artist Act of 2016” the Commission on the Arts and Humanities (CAH) has continued to research and discuss, with potential stakeholders, the best approach to facilitate the goals of the Jazz Preservation Act. As CAH Executive Director Espinoza stated in his hearing testimony, the Commission applauds the intent of this legislation, which is to preserve and celebrate the rich cultural history of Jazz, in addition to inspiring the next generation of jazz musicians. The Commission remains dedicated to working with our partners in the District to advance this very important mission.

The goals of the Jazz Preservation Act are more likely to be achieved through a non-legislative collaboration of the Commission, other District agencies, District jazz artists and non-profit/private art organizations (rather than by the enactment of the Jazz Preservation Act). The Commission ultimately determined that a majority of the various goals and responsibilities in the Jazz Preservation Act either are already being or should be handled by non-profit and other private District art and entertainment organizations (including some CAH grantees). The Commission shared these concerns and conclusions with this Committee in correspondence that it forwarded to the Council on December 23, 2016.

After reaching the above-referenced conclusions, the Commission began meeting with potential stakeholders to begin compiling a thorough “needs assessment” of our jazz and musical arts resources. To this end, the Commission has met with jazz artists, historians and related business owners who are actively working to facilitate the goals of the Bill. The Commission is dedicated to this “needs assessment” and hope that it will build upon the recommendations contained within the forthcoming Cultural Plan. It is clear that to accomplish the goals championed in the Jazz Preservation Act it will take a multi-agency effort to bridge across the educational, commercial, historical, technological, and performance goals of the legislation. We look forward to working with the Council to continue this work.



**26. Please provide an update on efforts to complete a revised Public Art Master Plan and a copy of any revisions to the plan.**

The plan is currently being updated with input from Commissioners and members of the Public Art Committee, who are public art professionals. We have also obtained input from other agencies such as the Office of Planning, along with national-level research in current trends and best practices from the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies. Updates to the plan include new focus areas and initiatives for CAH's public art program and revisions to the various processes by which CAH funds public art projects in the District to be in compliance with District government standards and national best practices in the field. The Plan will be presented to the Commission Board in March for approval.



**27. Please list any awards or accolades you have received or been nominated for in the past year.**

The DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities received overwhelming positive feedback from attendees to the Labor Day Weekend Music Festival and the 202 Arts and Music Festival. In particular, attendees to the Labor Day Music Festival were excited and encouraged to see an event such as this being presented on what has traditionally been an inactive weekend in the District. We also have received positive feedback from many of the recipients of the Heritage Grant Program that this program allows for better planning and management of their programs and activities.
