adding a new section 5b to read as follows	S:
"Sec. 5b. Coverage of women's pr	eventive health services.
"(a) An individual health plan o	r group health plan, a health insurer offering health
insurance coverage for prescription drugs	, and health insurance coverage through Medicaid and
the DC Alliance program shall provide	coverage for and shall not impose any cost sharing

38	requirements for the following preventive health services for women required under section 2713
39	of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, approved March 23, 2010 (124 Stat. 131; 42
