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L2 L3	To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve the salary adjustment for the Chancellor of the District of Columbia Public Schools.
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L5	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
L6	resolution may be cited as the "Chancellor of the District of Columbia Public Schools Salary
L7	Adjustment Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2015".
L8	Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve the salary adjustment for the
19	Chancellor of the District of Columbia Public Schools, established by section 1052 of the
20	District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective June
21	10, 1998 (D.C. Law 12-124; D.C. Official Code § 1-610.52).
22	(b) The legislation would approve the annual salary for the Chancellor of the District of
23	Columbia Public Schools ("DCPS") in the amount of \$284,000, based on the Chancellor's steady
24	leadership and continued progress of DCPS.
25	(c) Kayatanya Henderson was appointed Interim Chancellor of the District of Columbia
26	Public Schools on November 1, 2010, following the resignation of Michelle Rhee. On March
27	11, 2011, she was nominated to serve as Chancellor of the District of Columbia Public
28	Schools. Chancellor Henderson was unanimously confirmed by the Council on June 21, 2011
29	and has served as Chancellor continuously since that time.

- 1 (e) Over the past four years, DCPS under Chancellor Henderson's leadership, has
- 2 realized dramatic improvements towards the goals of increasing district-wide math and reading
- 3 proficiency, improving the proficiency rates of the DCPS' 40 lowest-performing schools,
- 4 increasing high school graduation rates, increasing student satisfaction, and increasing overall
- 5 DCPS enrollment.
- 6 (f) DCPS has increased audited enrollment to the highest level in over five years, with
- three consecutive years of growth. In 2014, DCPS students reached their highest proficiency
- 8 rates ever in reading and math. Graduation rates have been growing steadily each year with a
- 9 goal of 75% in 2017. In seat attendance has increased to 89% and truancy has been reduced by
- 10 18%. Since 2011, the results of the National Assessment of Education Progress show DC
- students improved in math and reading and demonstrated the greatest growth of any state in the
- 12 nation.
- 13 (g) Based on the dramatic improvements achieved under the steady leadership of the
- 14 Chancellor over the last four years and the commitment to continuing the progress of DCPS, the
- 15 Mayor has signed a new contract and made an adjustment to the Chancellor's present salary.
- 16 This emergency is necessary to reflect the salary adjustment as approved by the Mayor on
- 17 January 2, 2015.
- 18 Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
- 19 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the
- 20 Chancellor of the District of Columbia Public Schools Salary Adjustment Emergency Approval
- 21 Act of 2015 be approved after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall retroactively take effect on January 2, 2015.
