25	To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to amend the Vending
26	Regulation Act of 2009 to maintain criminal penalties for violations of the act.

28	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
29	act may be cited as the "Vending Regulations Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2015".
30	Sec. 2(a) In 2009, the Council passed the Vending Regulation Act of 2009, D.C. Law 18-
31	71, which authorized the Mayor to regulate vending in the District and required any proposed
32	rules to be submitted to the Council for review and approval.
33	(b) On March 8, 2013, the "Vending Business License Regulation Resolution of 2013"
34	was introduced in the Office of the Secretary by Chairman Mendelson at the request of the
35	Mayor. These regulations were adopted in part by the Council on June 4, 2013 with the passage
36	of the Vending Regulation Emergency Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Act 20-84; 60 DCR
37	9534), and the subsequent adoption of the Vending Regulation Second Emergency Amendment
38	Act of 2013 (D.C. Act 20-90; 60 DCR 9551).
39	(c) On September 20, 2013, the Office of the City Administrator published final rules in
40	the D.C. Register.

(d) The "Vending Business License Regulation Resolution of 2013" proposed in March
 2013 inadvertently removed provisions establishing criminal penalties for violations of the
 vending regulations.

4 (e) The Council approved the Vending Regulations Temporary Amendment Act of 2014
5 on June 3, 2014, which reinstated criminal penalties for vending until March 21, 2015. No
6 legislation has addressed criminal penalties for vending since that time.

(f) In order to permit complete enforcement of vending violations occurring in the
District of Columbia, and thereby avoid disruption of proper vending operations, it is necessary
to adopt emergency legislation to maintain criminal penalty provisions for violations of the act.

10 Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances 11 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the 12 Vending Regulations Emergency Act of 2015 be adopted after a single reading.

13 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
