## <u>Summary FY 2015 Second Quarter Anti-Deficiency Report – Operating Budget</u>

#### A. Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan:

- a. Based upon the OBP analysis of 119 agencies required to update a Spending Plan, seven agencies had potential Anti-Deficiency Violations.
- b. The agencies responded to the notice of potential referral and all agencies have either completed or are in the process of completing corrective actions.
- c. OBP has no Second Quarter Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan violations to report to BRADV.

### **B.** Timely FRP Submissions:

- a. 96 agencies were required to submit an FRP. 95 agencies submitted the Full FRP submission. Of the 95, 82 submitted by the due date, one agency submitted on May  $4^{\rm th}$  and the remaining 12 had approved extensions and submitted by May 8th.
- b. One agency (D.C. Public Charter School Board) did not submit their FRP.

## <u>Summary FY 2015 Third Quarter Anti-Deficiency Report – Operating Budget</u>

#### A. Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan:

- a. Based upon the OBP analysis of 120 agencies required to update a Spending Plan, eight agencies had potential Anti-Deficiency Violations.
- b. The agencies responded to the notice of potential referral and all agencies have either completed or are in the process of completing corrective actions.
- c. OBP has no Third Quarter Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan violations to report to BRADV.

## **B.** Timely FRP Submissions:

- a. 96 agencies were required to submit an FRP. 94 agencies submitted the Full FRP. Of the remaining two, one agency has an approved extension to August 7<sup>th</sup> and one agency did not submit an FRP, as listed next.
- b. D.C. Public Charter School Board did not submit their third quarter FRP.

## Summary FY 2016 First Quarter Anti-Deficiency Report - Operating Budget

#### A. Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan:

- a. 134 agencies were covered in our report, however, nine are excluded because the agencies do not use SOAR. Based upon the OBP analysis of 125 agencies required to update a Spending Plan, ten agencies had potential Anti-Deficiency Violations.
- b. The agencies responded to the notice of potential referral and all agencies have either completed or are in the process of completing corrective actions.
- c. OBP has no First Quarter Anti-Deficiency/Spending Plan violations to report to BRADV.

# **B.** Timely FRP Submissions:

- a. 100 agencies were required to submit an FRP. 88 agencies submitted the Full FRP on time. Of the remaining 12, <u>five</u> agencies had an approved extension to February 9<sup>th</sup>; <u>six</u> agencies submitted their FRPs late, without an approved extension.
- b. One agency, D.C. Public Charter School Board has not submitted an FRP for the first quarter.
