Vets on Honor Roll Are Mustered Out

More than 14 years after the last shot was fired, the District decided yesterday to muster out the veterans listed on the Roll of Honor in the District Building basement.

James A. Blaser, head of the District Building and Grounds Department, told the Commissioners yesterday the legend over the 1500 or so names still honors "... those who are serving our country in the armed forces of the United States."

Many of those listed have long been civilians, Blaser reported, and it would cost only about \$175 to change the plaque above the honor roll to read: "...

"... those who served our country in World War II." The Commissioners unanimously agreed to adopt the proper tense.
