On Tuesday, June 27, 2017, Councilmember Charles Allen, Chairperson of the Committee on the Judiciary and Public Safety, will convene a public roundtable to consider Proposed Resolutions 22-0318, the “District of Columbia Commission on Human Rights Eleanor Collinson Confirmation Resolution of 2017”, and 22-0327, the “Homeland Security Commission Philip McNamara Confirmation Resolution of 2017”. The roundtable will take place in Room 120 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004, at 2 p.m., or immediately following the Council’s Legislative Meeting, whichever is later.

PR22-0318 would confirm Eleanor Collinson to the Commission on Human Rights, replacing Rahim Jenkins, for a term to end December 31, 2018. PR22-0327 would confirm Philip McNamara to the Homeland Security Commission, replacing J. Michael Barrett, for a term to end February 8, 2019.

The Committee invites the public to testify or to submit written testimony. Representatives of organizations will be allowed a

maximum of five minutes for oral testimony, and individuals will be allowed a maximum of three minutes. Witnesses should bring **twenty single-sided copies** of their written testimony and, if possible, also submit a copy of their testimony electronically in advance to [judiciary@dccouncil.us](mailto:judiciary@dccouncil.us).

For witnesses who are unable to testify at the roundtable, written statements will be made part of the official record.
