27	resolution may be cited as the "Office of Public-Private Partnerships Delegation of Authority
28	Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2018".
29	Sec. 2. (a) The Office of Public-Private Partnerships ("OP3"), located within the Office
30	of the City Administrator, was established to facilitate public-private partnership projects in the
31	District independent of the authority of the Chief Procurement Officer ("CPO") and the
32	Procurement Practices Reform Act of 2010 ("PPRA").
33	(b) OP3 has worked with the CPO to leverage the Office of Contracting and
34	Procurement's ("OCP") considerable expertise in all aspects of contracting and procurement,
35	including development of requests for proposals through a Memorandum of Understanding.
36	(c) The PPRA gives the CPO authority to conduct procurements and award contracts on

- behalf of an independent agency, such as OP3, so long as the CPO follows the requirements of the PPRA. However, the OP3 enabling statute specifically exempts OP3 procurements from the PPRA.
- 40 (d) OCP has been working in partnership with OP3 to carry out certain contracting 41 functions, and has been carrying out those functions under OP3's enabling statute.
 - (e) The Council recently approved the Office of Public-Private Partnerships Delegation of Authority Temporary Amendment Act of 2018 to ensure that the existing partnership between OCP and OP3 can continue.
 - (f) In order to ensure that this authority extends back to when OCP and OP3 first began their contracting administration partnership, and to avoid any legal questions regarding that authority, it is important to amend existing law to make clear that the grant of authority is retroactive.
 - (g) In addition, to ensure statutory consistency, it is important to repeal the Office of Public-Private Partnerships Delegation of Authority Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2018.
 - Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Office of Public-Private Partnerships Delegation of Authority Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2018 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

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
