On Monday, April 29, 2019, Councilmember Charles Allen, Chairperson of the Committee on the Judiciary and Public Safety, will convene a public hearing to consider Bill 23-0212, the "Primary Date Alteration Amendment Act of 2019". The hearing will take place in Room 120 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., at 11:00 a.m.

The purpose of Bill 23-0212, the "Primary Date Alteration Amendment Act of 2019", is to amend the District of Columbia Election Code of 1955 to change the date of the District of Columbia primary election in presidential election years to the 1st Tuesday in June.

For witnesses who are unable to testify at the hearing, written statements will be made part of the official record. Copies of written statements should be submitted to the Committee at judiciary@dccouncil.us. The record will close at the end of the business day on April 30.
