17	appropriations, to authorize the Mayor to issue rules to implement provisions of
18	the act, and to require the Mayor to issue a report to Council evaluating the

20	DECOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA. That
21	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That
22	this resolution may be cited as the "Close Relative Caregiver Subsidy Pilot Program
23	Establishment Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2019".
24	Sec. 2. (a) The Grandparent Caregivers Program was first established in 2006 to
25	help provide stability to "grandfamilies", families in which grandparents are taking care
26	of their grandkids, with financial support.
27	(b) Testimony provided during the performance oversight proceedings for the
28	Child and Family Services Agency ("CFSA") demonstrated that a broader population of
29	kin caregivers exists in the District. One study from 2017 found that 9,000 District
30	children under 18 years of age were living in households led by relative caregivers that
31	were not grandparents.

1	(c) Furthermore, witnesses testified that many of these close relative caregivers
2	require immediate financial assistance to ensure that youth are afforded stability and are
3	not removed from a home with a close kinship relationship.

- (d) The Fiscal Year 2020 Local Budget Act of 2019, approved on second reading, includes funding for the establishment of a close relative caregiver subsidy pilot program ("pilot program"), to become available on October 1, 2010, the first day of Fiscal Year 2020.
- (e) Emergency legislation is necessary to ensure that CFSA is able to begin planning for the administration of the pilot programming, including hiring of one full time equivalent, during summer recess so that the program will be operational as soon as possible after the beginning of Fiscal Year 2020.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Close Relative Caregiver Subsidy Pilot Program Establishment Emergency Amendment Act of 2019 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
