16	To establish October 2, 2019 as the "District of Columbia Energy Efficiency Day".
17	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia recognizes that climate change is real;
18	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia is already taking steps to prepare for the impacts of
19	climate change through actions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and strategic resiliency
20	planning;
21	WHEREAS, deep decarbonization incorporates multiple pathways with an emphasis on
22	increasing energy efficiency and conservation, reducing carbon content in electricity and fuels,
23	and transitioning to low and progressively zero carbon energy;
24	WHEREAS, greenhouse gas emissions are directly tied to the built environment and
25	transportation, bold actions have to be taken to reduce energy consumption and transition to
26	lower or zero-emission transportation;
27	WHEREAS, the transition to zero carbon emitting sources goes beyond climate change,
28	by having a direct and significant impact on public health for all District residents;
29	WHEREAS, both new and existing buildings must become more energy efficient to
30	reduce the amount of greenhouse gas emissions they are contributing to the atmosphere,
31	partnership with the building industry will be key to achieving maximum results;
32	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia has pledged to reduce greenhouse gas emissions
33	50% below 2006 levels by 2032 and achieve carbon neutrality by 2050;
34	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia has been recognized nationally for bold action with
35	the passage of the Clean Energy DC Omnibus Amendment Act of 2018;
36	WHEREAS, energy efficiency is the cheapest, quickest, and cleanest way to meet our
37	energy needs and reduce utility bills for residential, business, and industrial customers;

38 39	WHEREAS, we must pursue the goal of reducing emissions and increasing energy efficiency, this must be done expeditiously with a focus on affordability;
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, this effort requires the partnership of numerous and diverse stakeholders to achieve, including the Government of the District of Columbia, the utilities, businesses, environmental organizations, nonprofit organizations, residents of the District of Columbia, universities;
14 15	WHEREAS, a nationwide network of energy efficiency groups and partners has designated the first Wednesday in October as the national annual Energy Efficiency Day;
16	WHEREAS, individual efforts when combined can have a broad impact on society;
17 18	WHEREAS, a voluntary Energy Efficiency Contest will be run, with the support of the electric utility, next year during peak demand summer months;
19 50	WHEREAS, a contest during this timeframe could maximize the amount of avoided electricity as well as carbon and save customers the most money in the process;
51 52	WHEREAS, individuals and organizations, in various categories, that have achieved the greatest reduction in energy consumption will be celebrated on Energy Efficiency Day in 2020;
53 54 55	RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "District of Columbia Energy Efficiency Day Recognition Resolution of 2019".
56 57 58	Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia recognizes Energy Efficiency Day and urges citizens to join us in supporting our clean energy goals and moving toward more energy efficiency now and in the future.
59 50	Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the first date of publication in the District of Columbia Register
