16	To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need to
17	amend the Data-Sharing and Information Coordination Amendment Act of 2010 to allow
18	the disclosure of health and human services information to aid in the development of the
19	report on the root causes of youth crime and the prevalence of adverse childhood
20	experiences among justice-involved youth; to amend the District of Columbia Mental
21	Health Information Act of 1978 to allow the disclosure of mental health information when
22	necessary to conduct an analysis of the root causes of youth crime and the prevalence of
23 24	adverse childhood experiences among justice-involved youth; to amend the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council for the District of Columbia Establishment Act of 2001 to
25	extend the deadline for submission of the analysis of the root causes of youth crime and
26	prevalence of adverse childhood experiences report to March 31, 2020, and to require that
27	certain District agencies provide the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council with
28	information necessary to complete the report; and to amend An Act To establish a Board
29	of Indeterminate Sentence and Parole for the District of Columbia and to determine its
30	functions, and for other purposes to clarify that amendments to section 3c of the act apply
31	to all proceedings pending in any District of Columbia court that were initiated under that
32	section.

35	resolution may be cited as the "Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Information Sharing
36	Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2019".

37	Sec. 2. (a) On July 9, 2019, the Council passed the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council
38	Information Sharing Emergency Amendment Act of 2019, effective July 24, 2019 (D.C. Act 23-
39	106; 66 DCR 9754), on final reading. This act expires on October 22, 2019.
40	(b) On September 17, 2019, the Council passed the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council
41	Information Sharing Temporary Amendment Act of 2019, enrolled version of B23-389 ( DCR
42	), on final reading. This bill was transmitted to the Mayor on September 23, 2019, and
43	therefore has yet to be transmitted for congressional review.
44	(c) This congressional review emergency legislation is now necessary to prevent a gap in
45	the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the anticipated effective date of the
46	temporary act.
47	Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
48	enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Crimina
49	Justice Coordinating Council Information Sharing Congressional Review Emergency Amendmen
50	Act of 2019 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
