It is my understanding that you are counsel to Digi Media.

I am writing this email to inform you that your client Digi Media, who has installed LED sign display monitors at 111 Mass Avenue NW without obtaining the appropriate required building permits for this illegal construction activity. The permits that were issued, which have been served a Notice of Intent To Revoke, authorized only the installation of brackets.

Please advise and encourage your client to remove these display sign monitors within 48 hours pursuant to our Corrective Order (attached) that was posted 1:35 pm August 16, 2016 at the subject location and emailed to you. The display monitors exceed the scope of any permit issued and is a violations of 12 DCMR.

If your client fails to remove them within prescribed period of time, DCRA we will have no option but to engage a contractor to remove the display monitors and place a lien(s) on your client and the property address building owners (who are named on building permit) for the costs incurred.

If DCRA is made to remove them, please reply with an address where the signs can be delivered back to your client.
