Richard Cohen, who owns the building at 1275 Pennsylvania Avenue NW, says the pavers in front of his building are a mess. He wants to replace them and will pay to have it done, or have his workers do the work, subject to DDOT's approval. He would like to get the pavers from DC though so that they match. He's very concerned that this work be done prior to the inauguration in January 2017.

I'm not sure of DDOT's feelings on this, but I do know that your sidewalk people are beyond busy, as I am sending over probably 10 requests a week for sidewalk repair,

some of which go back over a year. So, if there is a way to permit him to do this, it wouldn't have to come out of your sidewalk budget, that may be very stretched thin. Let me know what you think, or if you want someone to speak with him.
