Councilmember Trayon White, Sr. A PROPOSED RESOLUTION IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to establish a Ward 8 Senior Housing Fund to fund initiatives that create or maintain affordable housing for Ward 8 prioritizing residents age 65 or older. RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Ward 8 Senior Housing Fund Establishment Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020". Sec. 2. (a) The availability of affordable housing in Washington, D.C. has fallen dramatically in recent years. Affordable housing stock has trended downward while rents have trended upward—a pressure that is particularly felt by low-income tenants. (b) The District brought legal action against Curtis Investment, Inc., which owns, operates, and leases residential real estate in Ward 8, including Wheeler Park (3211-3221 Wheeler Road, S.E., Washington, D.C., 20032) and Oxon Run Manor (207 Mississippi Ave., S.E., Washington, D.C. 20032), because of allegations that Curtis discriminates against housing-assistance participants in leasing rental housing. Specifically, Curtis has posted advertisements for a residential property in the District that expressly state that it does not accept vouchers and other housing assistance.

1	(c) Ward 8 is facing an affordable housing emergency, particularly for senior
2	citizens that prefer to age-in-place or need new housing that can accommodate their
3	fixed-incomes.
4	(d) Because the settlement the District is receiving in the Curtis matter involves
5	affordable housing and a great number of Ward 8 residents, it is imperative that the
6	Council capture a portion of this settlement to be used for Ward 8 senior housing.
7	Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the
8	circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it
9	necessary that the "Ward 8 Senior Housing Fund Establishment Emergency Amendment
10	Act of 2020" be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
