23 24 25 26 27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Medical Marijuana Program Patient Employment Protection Declaration Resolution of 2020".
28	Sec. 2. (a) On June 18, 2019, the Council passed the Medical Marijuana Program Patient
29	Employment Protection Emergency Amendment Act of 2019, enacted on July 8, 2019 (D.C. Act
30	23-77; 66 DCR 8089), which expired on October 6, 2019.
31	(b) On July 9, 2019, the Council passed the Medical Marijuana Program Patient
32	Employment Protection Temporary Amendment Act of 2019, on final reading, enacted on
33	September 5, 2019, (D.C. Law 23-26; 66 DCR 15182).
34	(c) On September 17, 2019, due to a delay in the transmission of the Medical Marijuana
35	Program Patient Employment Protection Temporary Amendment Act of 2019, the Council passed
36	the Medical Marijuana Program Patient Employment Protection Congressional Review

- Emergency Amendment Act of 2019, to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the anticipated effective date of the temporary act.
- 39 (d) The Medical Marijuana Program Patient Employment Protection Temporary 40 Amendment Act of 2019, enacted on September 5, 2019 (D.C. Act 23-114), is set to expire on 41 June 5, 2020, and no permanent legislation is in place because the work on the permanent 42 legislation was interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic response.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the
 Medical Marijuana Program Patient Employment Protection Emergency Amendment Act of
 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- 47 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
