16	To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to give the Mayor the
17	authority to grant a property owner's request to make a property ineligible for residential
18	parking permits when the property does not have any residents at the time of the request.

20	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
21	resolution may be cited as the "RPP Voluntary Exclusion Emergency Declaration Resolution of
22	2020".
23	Sec. 2. (a) On April 20, 2020, the District Department of Transportation ("DDOT")
24	submitted a memorandum in support of the developer to the District of Columbia Board of
25	Zoning Adjustment ("BZA") for BZA Case No. 20266 - 3400 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., in
26	regards to reducing the minimum number of parking spaces required at the site of a new housing
27	development.
28	(b) As part of the Memorandum in support, DDOT notes that the property owner will
29	"prohibit residents at the property from participating in the Residential Parking Permit ("RPP")
30	Program."
31	(c) DDOT has no legal means to ensure the property owner abides by the requirement
32	noted in subsection (b).

- (d) Without this requirement being enforced, residents of the new development will be able to receive RPP for their vehicles, likely leading to insufficient street parking for existing residents in the neighborhood.
- (e) In an April 16, 2020 Memorandum on a study commissioned by the developer, the study team noted that during certain rush-hour periods, parking in the neighborhood is at 98% of capacity.
 - (f) The BZA's hearing on the matter is scheduled for July 29, 2020.
- (g) Emergency legislation is necessary to ensure that DDOT has the legal means necessary to prohibit property occupants who have previously agreed not to participate in RPP from participating in RPP.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the RPP Voluntary Exclusion Emergency Act of 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
