

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on an emergency basis, title 16 of the District of Columbia Official Code in an action for personal injury or death caused by wrongful act, neglect, or default, estimations, measures, or calculations of past, present, or future damages for lost earnings or impaired earning capacity may not be reduced based on race, ethnicity, or gender.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Stormiyah Denson-Jackson Race and Gender Economic Damages Temporary Amendment Act of 2020”.

Sec. 2. Title 16 of the District of Columbia Official Code is amended as follows:

(a) The table of contents is amended by adding after the phrase “28. Medical Malpractice.....16-2801” the phrase “28A. Economic damages for personal injury and wrongful death .....16-2871”.

(b) A new chapter 28A is added to read as follows:

“CHAPTER 28A

36 Economic Damages Equality Emergency Act of 2020, passed on emergency basis on July 7,  
37 2020 (Bill 23-\_\_\_).”.

39 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact  
40 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved  
41 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code §1-301.47a).

43 (a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by  
44 the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review  
45 as provided in section 602(c)(1)of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December  
46 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of  
47 Columbia Register.

48 (b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect.

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55 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the  
56 84 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer  
57 than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in  
58 section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87  
59 Stat. 788; 87 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
