TITLE RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE ADOPTION OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
PLANKS IN THE 1972 REPUBLICAN PARTY PLATFORM

Chairman John A. Nevius Presents the following Resolution:

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WHEREAS, the D. C. Delegation to the Republican National Convention in Miami, Florida, later this month has asked for an expression of opinion from the D. C. City Council regarding subject matter for possible adoption by the Platform Committee of that Convention; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the interests of the citizens of the District for that Platform Committee to adopt the following "planks";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the District of Columbia Council hereby recommends to the 1972 Convention of the Republican Party the adoption in its platform of "planks" supporting in principle:

1. Full self-government for the citizens of the District of Columbia with appropriate protection of the Federal interests in this City.
2. Full voting representation for the District of Columbia in the United States Congress.
3. The plans of the Administration and the City Government relating to observance of the Bicentennial in Washington in 1976.

AND RESOLVED FURTHER that the District of Columbia Council hereby enthusiastically applauds the significant reduction in major crime in the City of Washington over the last three years, which has resulted from cooperative efforts on the part of the President, the Congress, the Mayor and the City Council.

Councilman Carlton W. Veazey Presents the following Resolution:

- 1 WHEREAS, the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority has requested
2 that the District of Columbia Council order certain segments of D. C. Transit-owned
3 street railway tracks removed; and
4
5 WHEREAS, Removal of these segments of D. C. Transit-owned street railway
6 tracks is necessary for Phases III and IVa of Metro construction; and
7
8 WHEREAS, Paragraph 170, Section 402, of Reorganization Plan No. 3 of
9 1967 transferred to the District of Columbia Council the function of ordering the
10 removal of abandoned street railway tracks.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the District of Columbia Council that:

14 Section 1. D. C. Transit System Inc. is hereby ordered to remove or have
15 removed the following sections of street railway tracks by September 1, 1972.

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Section 2. The Committee is charged with the responsibility of reviewing the effectiveness of the Abortion Control Regulation particularly in regard to the role of counseling in abortion clinics, the qualifications of abortion counselors and the 24-hour waiting period requirement between the initial visit to the clinic and the actual performance of the abortion. 7 guardian who resides in the District of Columbia, or is
8 not an orphan, there shall be paid to the Board of Education
9 the amount fixed by the Board of Education pursuant to
10 subsection (b) of this section.

12 (b) The amount which shall be paid with respect to each
13 person subject to subsection (a) of this section shall be
14 fixed by the Board of Education with the approval of the
15 Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia as the
16 amount necessary to cover the expense of tuition and cost
17 of textbooks and school supplies used by such person."



24 regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. Any such
25 contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible
26 bidder."

28 (2) The District of Columbia Council requests rapid and affirmative action
29 on the amendment by the Congress of the United States to guarantee that the benefits

1 WHEREAS, the Council wishes to improve the capacity of the city
2 government to serve members of the community who are working to expand
3 housing, employment, industrial and commercial opportunities in urban
4 renewal areas and other less affluent sections of the city; and

6 WHEREAS, the Council finds that the appointment of citizens with
7 certain interests and expertise who agree to serve as volunteer advisers in
8 an organized fashion is in the public interest.

14 on Housing, Industrial and Commercial Development to advise the Council,
15 through its Committee on Housing and Urban Development, on ways to improve

17 urban renewal areas and other less affluent sections of the city.

19 Section 2. The Commission shall be composed of eleven (11) members
20 who shall be knowledgeable and interested in urban and industrial development
21 and who shall be appointed by the Councils' Housing and Urban Development
22 Committee. The members of the Commission and any volunteer staff shall serve
23 without compensation.

25 Section 3. The Commission shall undertake to study and recommend
26 to the Council measures to encourage development of housing, employment and
27 commercial opportunities in urban renewal areas and other less affluent sections
28 of the city. To this end, the Commission shall have as its primary goal practical
29 results on the neighborhood level and shall consult with existing economic
30 development, neighborhood, civic, and business groups before making any
31 recommendations.

26 standards for facilities, personnel and programs for all 24 hour child care facilities
27 caring for dependent children under the jurisdiction of the Department of Human Resources
28 and a monitoring system to ensure compliance with such standards. The Committee is
29 to meet with the Corporation Counsel and the D.C. Superior Court to review the legal
30 basis and court process relating to the commitment of children, review of commitment
31 and the severance of parental rights and develop appropriate recommendations. The
32 Committee is to review the plans for the proposed forty-bed medical screening center
33 and clarify the basis on which payments are made for the care of dependent children.




