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15 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

16 To amend, on an temporary basis, the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development
17 Limited Grant-Making Authority Act of 2012 to clarify that, during a public health
18 emergency, grants made to retail business establishments in Great Streets corridors, for
19 certain purposes, must be made available to all retail business establishments, that are
20 small, local businesses, in the District.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
22 act may be cited as the “Retail Establishment Grant Parity Temporary Amendment Act of 2020”.

23 Sec. 2. Section 2032(a)(5) of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development
24 Limited Grant-Making Authority Act of 2012 (D.C. Law 19-168; D.C. Official Code § 1-
25 328.04(a)(5)) is amended as follows:

26 (a) The existing language is redesignated as subparagraph (A).

27 (b) A new subparagraph (B) is added to read as follows:

28 “(B) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a grant offered pursuant to
29 subparagraph (A) of this paragraph to a retail establishment, as that term is defined in D.C.
30 Official Code § 47-2001(m), during a period of time for which the Mayor has declared a public
31 health emergency pursuant to section 5a of the District of Columbia Public Emergency Act of
32 1980, effective October 17, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-494; D.C. Official Code § 7-2304.01), shall be

33 offered to all retail establishments in the District that are eligible to be certified as a small
34 business enterprise, pursuant to section 2332 of the Small, Local, and Disadvantaged Business
35 Enterprise Development and Assistance Act of 2005, effective October 20, 2005 (D.C. Law 16-
36 33; D.C. Official Code § 2-218.32), if the grant allows an awardee to use funds for any of
37 following purposes:

- 38 “(i) Assistance with small business retention and attraction
39 programs;
- 40 “(ii) Mitigation of blight and vacant property growth;
- 41 “(iii) Supporting the pivoting of business operations into the digital
42 market; or
- 43 “(iv) Layoff aversion.”

44 Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

45 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
46 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
47 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

48 Sec. 4. Effective date.

49 (a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by
50 the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
51 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24,
52 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
53 Columbia Register.

54 (b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect.
