32 33 34	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that about 42,170 women in the United States will die from the disease in 2020; of those cases, about 100 will be women in the District;	

35 36	WHEREAS, approximately 2,620 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in men before the end of 2020; of those cases, about 520 men will die from the disease;
37 38 39	WHEREAS, there are several types of breast cancer—divided into non-invasive and invasive types—which can be diagnosed at different stages of development and can grow at different rates;
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, if cancer is detected at an early stage, it can be treated before it spreads to other parts of the body. And, while the exact cause of breast cancer is not fully understood, there are many factors that increase the likelihood of developing it, including age and family medical history;
44 45 46	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society is a community-based, voluntary health organization, located both nationwide and in the District of Columbia, which is dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health problem;
47 48 49	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society established Breast Cancer Awareness Month in 1985 to promote mammography as the most effective weapon in the fight against breast cancer; and
50 51	WHEREAS, the District of Columbia anticipates the day when no woman or man suffers from breast cancer or loses their life to this disease.
52 53 54	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Breast Cancer Awareness Month Recognition Resolution of 2020."
55 56 57	Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia honors breast cancer patients, survivors, and their families and recognizes October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month to promote research for a cure.
