A PROPOSED RESOLUTION
IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to close a loophole in the existing law that allows large out of state firms to certify as local business enterprises.
RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
resolution may be cited as the "Local Business Enterprise Clarification Declaration Resolution of
2020".
Sec. 2. (a) The goal of the District of Columbia's Department of Small and Local
Business Development is to stimulate and foster the economic growth and development of
businesses based in the District of Columbia. Due to a loophole in existing law, many large and
out-of-District firms have been able to legally certify as local business enterprises.
(b) Although, there are over 1,800 certified business enterprises ("CBEs"), between 2016
and 2018, a total of 1,326 business firms were awarded contracts under the District's
procurement process. Among the 1,326 firms, 730 (55%) were located within the District and
596 (45%) were located outside of the District. Among the 1,326 firms, 870 (66%) were non-
CBEs and 456 (34%) were CBEs.

- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Local Business Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
