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13	To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to
14	the need to require employers to adopt and implement social distancing policies
15	that adheres to Mayor's Order 2020-080 or subsequent Mayor's Order, to prohibit
16	retaliation against an employee who refuses to work with or serve an individual
17	who refuses to comply with Mayor's Order 2020-080, to prohibit retaliation
18	against employees for other reasons, to authorize the Mayor and Attorney General
19	to administer and enforce workplace and employee protections in title I, to
20	authorize the Attorney General to bring civil actions in a court of competent
21	jurisdiction, to authorize the Chief Procurement Officer to enter into an indefinite
22	duration/indefinite quantity contract to assist eligible businesses in the purchase of
23	personal protective equipment and other supplies related to the containment of
24	COVID-19, to permit federal laws, polices, and standards or a Mayor's Order that
25	contains stricter personal protective equipment standards, to preempt the terms of
26	title I; and to amend the Small and Certified Business Enterprise Act of 2005 to
27	authorize the Mayor to issue grants for small businesses to purchase or receive
28	reimbursements for the purchase of personal protective equipment for their
29	employees.
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31	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That
32	this resolution may be cited as the "Protecting Businesses and Workers from COVID-19
33	Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020".
34	Sec. 2. (a) On July 28, 2020, the Council passed the Protecting Businesses and
35	Workers from COVID-19 Emergency Amendment Act of 2020, effective August 13,
36	2020 (D.C. Act 23-384; 67 DCR 9870) ("emergency Act"), which is set to expire on
37	November 10, 2020. The emergency Act created important COVID-19-related workers'
38	rights, protections against retaliation if they act to protect their safety and health, and

- 1 enforcement mechanisms; and the Act authorized additional resources for businesses to
- 2 purchase personal protective equipment during the COVID-19 public health emergency.
- 3 (b) On September 22, 2020, the Council passed the Protecting Businesses and
- 4 Workers from COVID-19 Temporary Amendment Act of 2020, passed on 2nd reading on
- 5 September 22, 2020 (Enrolled version of Bill 23-402), which is currently under Mayoral
- 6 review.
- 7 (c) In order to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency
- 8 Act and the effective date of the temporary legislation, it is necessary to approve
- 9 congressional review emergency legislation.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
- enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the
- 12 Protecting Businesses and Workers from COVID-19 Congressional Review Emergency
- 13 Amendment Act of 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
