SUBJECT: Request to Place Emergency Measures on the Agenda for December 15, 2020
Additional Legislative Meeting

This memo is to request that the following measures be placed on the agenda for the December 15, 2020 Additional Legislative Meeting, should one occur:

- Modifications to Human Care Agreement No. CW79329 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020
- Modifications to Human Care Agreement No. CW79329 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2020

The modifications 17, 18, and 19 are to the contract through the Department of Behavioral Health with MBI Health Services for continued Mental Health Rehabilitation Services (MHRS) to consumers, including diagnostic/assessment, medication/somatic, counseling and psychotherapy, community support services, and supported employment services. The base period amount was approved for \$2.5M (CA22-0388), and Option Years One and Two were approved for the same amount (CA22-0537 and A23-0211, respectively). The contract is currently in Option Year Three (September 6, 2020 through September 5, 2021).

Modification No. 17, dated August 29, 2020, exercised partial Option Year Three for the period from September 6, 2020 through December 31, 2020, in the not-to-exceed amount of \$950,000. Modification No. 18 was an administrative modification that did not increase the not-to-exceed amount of Option Year Three. Modification No. 19 is necessary to exercise the remainder of Option Year Three for the period from January 1, 2021 through September 5, 2021 in the not-to-exceed amount of \$2.2M, bringing the total not-to-exceed amount for Option Year Three to \$3.1M. Modification is necessary to allow for the continuation of vital MHRS services.
