SUBJECT: Request to Place Emergency Measures on the Agenda for December 15, 2020
Additional Legislative Meeting

This memo is to request that the following measures be placed on the agenda for the December 15, 2020 Additional Legislative Meeting, should one occur:

- Contract No. NFPHC-WC-21-CPC-00009 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Manufacturers Alliance Insurance Company Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2020
- Contract No. NFPHC-WC-21-CPC-00009 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Manufacturers Alliance Insurance Company Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020

This emergency legislation and declaration resolution would provide retroactive approval for Contract No. NFPHC-WC-21-CPC-00009 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation and Manufacturers Alliance Insurance Company for the provision of workers' compensation insurance for the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation, and authorize payment for the services received and to be received under this proposed Contract.

Council action is necessary to retroactively approve the proposed Contract in the amount of \$1,558,062.00 for the period that began November 23, 2020 to November 22, 2021. The proposed Contract is retroactive because not only did the NFPHC change its broker mid-year, but early proposals received reflected higher premiums that were due to COVID-19 increases for hospitals. But for the broker change and additional time taken to ensure maximum contract value for the NFPHC's actual risk, the proposed Contract would have been timely transmitted to Council.

Emergency approval of this legislation and declaration resolution would approve this Contract and would enable Manufacturers Alliance Insurance Company to receive payment for the provision of these critical services at UMC.
