16 To amend, on an emergency basis, the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment
17 Initiative of 1999 to eliminate the limit on the number of plants that a cultivation center
18 may grow.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
21 act may be cited as the “Medical Marijuana Plant Count Elimination Congressional Review
22 Emergency Amendment Act of 2020”.

23 Sec. 2. Section 7(e)(2) of the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative
24 of 1999, effective July 27, 2010 (D.C. Law 18-210; D.C. Official Code § 7-1671.06(e)(2)), is
25 repealed.

26 Sec. 3. Applicability.

27 This act shall apply as of October 3, 2020.

28 Sec. 4. Fiscal impact.

29 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
30 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
31 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

32 Sec. 5. Effective date.

33 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
34 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than
35 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
36 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
37 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
