22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA,
23	That this act may be cited as the "Third-Party Food Pickup Commission Temporary
24	Amendment Act of 2021".
25	Sec. 2. Section 205(b) of the Coronavirus Support Temporary Amendment Act of
26	2020, effective October 9, 2020 (D.C. Law 23-130; 67 DCR 8622) is amended to read as
27	follows:
28	"(b) Notwithstanding any provision of District law, during a public health
29	emergency it shall be unlawful for a person to cause a third-party food delivery platform
30	to charge a restaurant:
31	(1) A commission fee for use of the platform's services for delivery that
32	totals more than 15% of the purchase price per online order; or
33	(2) A commission fee for use of the platform's services that totals more
34	than 5% of the purchase price per online order where the platform does not provide

35 delivery of an order, including orders that are picked up from the restaurant by the customer or for which the restaurant provides its own delivery service.". 36 Sec. 3. Official Code § 1-45 46 206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

(b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect.
