Sec. 2. (a) The Legalization	on of Marijuana for I	Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999
legalized medical cannabis in the	District and created	the medical cannabis program.
(b) The Alcoholic Bevera	ge Regulation Admi	nistration (ABRA) registers a limited
number of dispensaries, cultivation	on centers, and testin	ng laboratories within the medical can
program.		
(c) Dispensary, cultivation	n center, and testing	laboratory licenses are valid for one y
and must be renewed annually to	maintain licensure.	

(d) The District currently has 7 licensed dispensaries, 8 licensed cultivation centers, and no licensed testing laboratories.

- (e) For the upcoming application period, ABRA has made licenses available for two new cultivation centers, one dispensary, and two testing laboratories.
- (f) The overwhelming majority of returning citizens in the District are Black residents who were unjustly targeted by over-policing, sentencing disparities, and illegal drug laws, including marijuana, yet are completely left out of the cannabis space as owners and operators.
- (g) As a result, the medical cannabis program lacks ownership equity and inclusion for returning citizens who were previously incarcerated for the manufacture, distribution, or possession, with intent to manufacture or distribute a controlled substance.
- (h) Applications for license registrations are only accepted during open application windows.
- (i) ABRA has begun requesting Letters of Intent from those who are interested in applying for the available licenses.
- (j) To ensure that returning citizens who were previously incarcerated for the manufacture, distribution, or possession, with intent to manufacture or distribute a controlled substance have equitable access to register as dispensary, cultivation center, or testing laboratory owners the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999 needs to be amended on an emergency basis.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the "Returning Citizens Cannabis Equity Emergency Amendment Act of 2021" be *adopted after a single reading*.

1 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
