21	Sec. 2. Tolling of deadlines under commercial insurance policies.
22	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of District law and notwithstanding the terms of any
23	policy of insurance subject to this section, for commercial policies of insurance issued by a
24	licensed insurer, in force as of March 25, 2020, and that include coverage under the existing
25	policy for losses in the District, the running of all time periods for policy holders to exercise
26	rights under a policy or District law for a claim for a loss shall by tolled during the period of a
27	public health emergency declared pursuant to section 5a of the District of Columbia Public
28	Emergency Act of 1980, effective October 17, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-194; D.C. Official Code § 7-
29	2304.01), and for 90 days thereafter.
30	(b) For the purposes of this section, the term "loss" means physical loss of property, loss
31	of use of property, loss of occupancy, property damage, loss of income, incurred expenses, and
32	other business interruption losses.
