1 2 Councilmember Anita Bonds 3 4 5 A PROPOSED RESOLUTION 6 7 8 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA 9 10 11 To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to provide for a limited 12 exception to the eviction moratorium, enacted by the Coronavirus Support Emergency 13 Act of 2021, and to the Eviction Notice Moratorium Temporary Amendment Act of 2020, to allow the eviction process to resume, under a narrow set of defined causes when 14 15 necessary to ensure health and safety in residential communities, while respecting the public and individual health goals of the eviction moratorium, during the public health 16 17 emergency and for 60 days thereafter. 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this 20 act may be cited as the "Eviction Moratorium Public Safety Exception Emergency Declaration 21 Resolution of 2021." 22 Sec. 2. (a) On March 17, 2020 the Council of the District of Columbia passed the 23 COVID-19 Response Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 (D.C. Act 23-247; 67 DCR 3093) to 24 address the effects of the coronavirus pandemic. 25 (b) Section 308 of the COVID-19 Response Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 (D.C. 26 Act 23-247; 67 DCR 3093) amended D.C. Official Code § 16-1502 and section 501(k) of the 27 Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-10; D.C. Official Code § 42-28 3505.01(k)) to prohibit evictions during a period in which the Mayor has declared a public health 29 emergency. 30 (c) The prohibition on evictions mentioned above was renewed on March 1, 2021 when 31 the Council of the District of Columbia passed the Coronavirus Support Emergency Amendment 32 Act of 2021 (D.C. Act 24-30; 68 DCR 3101). 33 (d) On September 22, 2020 the Council of the District of Columbia Council passed the

- Eviction Notice Moratorium Temporary Amendment Act of 2020 (D.C. Act 23-415; 67 DCR 12243) to prohibit eviction notices during a period of time in which the Mayor has declared a public health emergency.
  - (e) Since the implementation of the prohibitions on evictions and filing of eviction notices, we have heard from housing providers and tenants alike as to the risk that a small group of tenants across the city have posed due to criminal mischief and public safety hazards and the inability of the housing provider to do anything to remove these tenants due to the ongoing moratorium on evictions and eviction moratoriums.
  - (f) The aforementioned circumstances have made it clear that a narrow exception to the prohibition on evictions and eviction notices is needed in order to protect our residents and tenants.
  - Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary to provide for a public safety exception to the moratorium on evicting tenants.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
