22	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
23	resolution may be cited as the "Engineering License Emergency Declaration Resolution of
24	2021".
25	Sec. 2. (a) D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.133 provides that no person may engage in the
26	practice of engineering or use the title "engineer" unless they are licensed to practice
27	engineering.
28	(b) Employees and consultants of the District government and independent agencies were
29	exempted from this requirement until 2017, when D.C. Law 21-272 repealed that exemption.
30	(c) Independent agencies have been working to become compliant with the law, but
31	licensure requirements include obtaining an undergraduate engineering degree and passing the
32	verification of the fundamentals examination that necessitate additional time, particularly for
33	current employees of these agencies who cannot be easily transition to different roles or be

- removed from projects to accommodate the time necessary to complete these licensure requirements.
- (d) DCRA has indicated that it will start penalizing individuals at independent agencies who are not in compliance with D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.133 on August 1, 2021. This could adversely affect agencies that still have dozens of employees doing engineering work who have yet to complete all the requirements necessary to get a professional engineering license.
- (e) To ensure that the operations of government or independent agencies are not negatively affected by this looming enforcement action, it is necessary to temporarily reestablish the exemption to licensure requirements for agency employees who may need to engage in engineering work while under the supervision of a professional engineer who can verify that his or her work is in compliance with all applicable laws and rules of the District.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that Engineering Licensure Emergency Amendment Act of 2021 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
