**RE:** Request to Agendize Measures for the June 1, 2021 Legislative Meeting

**DATE:** May 26, 2021

Pursuant to Council Rule 426, regarding a waiver of Rule 231(c), I request that the following measure be agendized for the June 1, 2021 Legislative Meeting. I also request that this measure be agendized for an Additional Meeting of the Committee of the Whole, pursuant to Rule 403 (b), should one be scheduled. This measure was marked up by the Committee on Business and Economic Development and has been filed timely with the Secretary's Office:

## Measure from the Committee

• Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration Frederick P. Moosally Confirmation Resolution of 2021

This measure would confirm the reappointment of Frederick P. Moosally, a Ward 3 resident, as Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) for a four-year term. Mr. Moosally has served as the Director of ABRA since 2009 and has more than 20 years of experience in local and federal government. Prior to leading ABRA, Mr. Moosally served for seven years as General Counsel in the Office of Attorney General's ABRA adjudication division. Mr. Moosally has focused his efforts on legislation to boost access to DC-made products: deliver outstanding customer service; solicit and incorporate input; improve transparency; and protect the health and safety of the District's residents and visitors, alike. His efforts have earned ABRA national accolades, including the National Liquor Law Enforcement Association's Agency of the Year in 2018, and the Innovative Alcohol Law Enforcement Program of the Year in 2017 and 2020.

I am also writing to request that the following emergency measures be placed on the agenda for the Legislative Meeting on June 1, 2021.

## Emergency Measure:

- Real Property Tax Sale COVID-19 Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2021
- Real Property Tax Sale COVID-19 Equitable Emergency Amendment Act of 2021
- Real Property Tax Sale COVID-19 Equitable Temporary Amendment Act of 2021

This legislation would amend Section 47-1332 of the District of Columbia Official Code to cancel the tax sale in calendar year 2021, and to require that notice of the cancellation be mailed to affected property owners. The real property tax sale is a public auction conducted pursuant to District law by the Office of Tax and Revenue. Canceling the tax sale will allow property owners and businesses that are directly and indirectly impacted by the pandemic to focus on recovery.

Furthermore, the tax sale has consistently been attended by significant numbers of persons, preventing social distancing in the site generally reserved for the tax sale, and requires nearly three months to plan. The current public health emergency and uncertainty of future conditions impede the ability to set a tax sale date and site.

## Contract on behalf of the Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking

- Modifications to Contract No. CW64488 with Capital Area Asset Builders (CAAB) Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2021
- Modifications to Contract No. CW64488 with Capital Area Asset Builders (CAAB) Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2021

There exists an immediate need to approve proposed Modification No. 5 to Contract No. CW64488 with Capital Area Asset Builders (CAAB) to administer the District's Opportunity Accounts Program on behalf of the Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking. The purpose of this contract is to increase the ability of low-income individuals and families to save and expend money for business start-up costs, job training, education, and the purchase or major repair of a primary residence. Once program participants save \$1,500 they receive matching funds provided by the District government, federal government, or third-party entities for each dollar saved. Due to the impact of COVID-19, it is urgent that the program expand to assist more households and cover additional expenses. Accordingly, this contract exercises Option Year Two and enables the program to double the number of persons served and increases the allowable uses of funds to cover emergency medical expenses and the purchase of a vehicle.

The proposed period of performance for the remaining balance of Option Year Two is through September 28, 2021. The proposed change of Contract modification No. 5 and its period of performance is the date of award to September 28, 2021.
