act may be cited as the "Targeted Historic Preservation	on Assistance Emergency Amendment Act
of 2021".	
Sec. 2. Section 11b the Historic Landmark and	d Historic District Protection Act of 1978,
effective March 2, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-189; D.C. Offi	icial Code § 6-1110.02), is amended as
follows:	
(a) Subsection (d) is amended to read as follow	vs:
"(d) A grant shall not exceed \$25,000; except,	that a grant may be a maximum of
"(1) \$35,000 if the structure is located	in the Anacostia Historic District; or
"(2) \$500,000 if the structure is a mult	ifamily common interest community.
(b) A new subsection (g-1) is added to read as	follows:
"(g-1)(1) A grant may be made to a multifami	ly common interest community, as defined
in section 2232(3) of the Common Interest Communi	ty Repairs Amendment Act of 2018.

- effective October 30, 2018 (D.C. Law 22-168, D.C. Official Code § 42-2071(3)), located in the
   Meridian Hill Historic District and the Mount Pleasant Historic District, for the cost of
   rehabilitation attributable to the common interest community.
- "(2) The Mayor shall ensure that all funds granted to a common interestcommunity are used to pay for the approved rehabilitation work.
- 41 "(3) If the grant is to be used for the cost of rehabilitation to common elements, as
  42 defined in section 2232(2) of the Common Interest Community Repairs Amendment Act of
  43 2018, effective October 30, 2018 (D.C. Law 22-168, D.C. Official Code § 42-2071(2)), the
  44 preservation covenant required under subsection (i) must be entered into by the unit owners'
  45 association or, if applicable, the master association."

- This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
