

A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on a temporary basis, an order the widening of a portion of W Street, SE, between Railroad Avenue, SE to the northwest and Shannon Place, SE to the southeast, and to provide for the establishment of a non-exclusive easement to the District of Columbia for the surface rights to that portion of private property located adjacent to W Street in Square 5784.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Dedication of a Portion of W Street, SE, S.O. 16-24322 Temporary Amendment Act of 2021”.

Sec. 2. (a) Pursuant to section 302 of the Street and Alley Closing and Acquisition Procedures Act of 1982, effective March 10, 1983 (D.C. Law 4-201; D.C. Official Code § 9-203.02), the Council accepts the dedication of land by easement for public space purposes for the portion of W Street, SE, located between Railroad Avenue and Shannon Place, SE, as shown on the Surveyor’s Plat in the S.O. File 16-24322.

(b) The approval of the Council’s acceptance of the dedication of land described in subsection (a) is contingent upon the satisfaction of all conditions set forth in the S.O. File 16-24322, including the establishment of a non-exclusive surface easement to the District of Columbia over Lots 899 and 900 in Square 5784 to establish a 70-foot right-of-way on W Street, as shown on the Surveyor’s Plat.

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

33 (a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by
34 the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review
35 as provided in section 602(c)(1)of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
36 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
37 Columbia Register.

38 (b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect. This act shall take effect
39 following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to
40 override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for
41 emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of
42 Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; 87 D.C. Official Code §
43 1-204.12(a)).

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
