10	IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

14	To declare December 10, 2021, as Human Rights Day in the District of Columbia and to reaffirm
15	the Council's commitment to defending human rights.
16	
17	WHEREAS, on December 10, 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the
18	Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), a global commitment to dignity, liberty, and
19	equality regardless of status and lays out civil, social, economic, and other rights;
20	WHEREAS, in the decades since, the UDHR and its principles have inspired
21	transformational legal and social innovations around the world;
22	WHEREAS, on December 13, 1977, less than 4 years after enactment of the District of
23	Columbia Home Rule Act, the District of Columbia adopted the Human Rights Act of 1977
24	(DCHRA), which declared "the intent of the Council of the District of Columbia to secure an
25	end in the District of Columbia to discrimination for any reason other than that of individual
26	merit";
27	WHEREAS, the Council has from time to time expanded and refined the DCHRA, which
28	now prohibits discrimination in settings including housing, employment, public
29	accommodations, and educational institutions based on over 20 types of protected characteristics;

30	WHEREAS, in 2008, the District of Columbia committed itself to serving as a Human
31	Rights City by modeling how to "make every citizen a partner of sustainable change" and by
32	building human rights into ongoing civic dialogue as a way of life;
33	WHEREAS, the Office of Human Rights and the Commission on Human Rights were
34	established to eradicate discrimination, increase equal opportunity and protect human rights for
35	persons who live in, work in, or visit the District of Columbia;
36	WHEREAS, the work of recognizing and protecting the human rights of District
37	residents is never complete;
38	WHEREAS, District residents continue to lead the fight to perfect our human rights laws
39	in the District and around the world;
40	WHEREAS, the Council is evaluating legislation to ensure that residents experiencing
41	homelessness, among other groups, are better protected from discrimination; and
42	WHEREAS, the Council remains committed to ensuring that the District of Columbia
43	remains a leading jurisdiction in promoting dignity, liberty, equality, and freedom from
44	discrimination.
45	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
46	resolution may be cited as the "Human Rights Day Recognition Resolution of 2021".
47	Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia reaffirms its dedication to human rights
48	in the District and around the world, and declares December 10, 2021 as "Human Rights Day" in
49	the District of Columbia.
50	Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the first date of publication in
51	the District of Columbia Register.
