WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson helped produce hit records for influential musicians, such as Nas, Usher, TLC, New Edition, Raheem DeVaughn, and Faith Evans throughout the 1990s and early 2000s. Chucky also demonstrated his versatility by collaborating with artists in different genres;

WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson helped shape the unique sound of '90s R&B, striking a
 balance between new and old sounds through the use of samples, thumping basslines, and
 percussion;

46 WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson opened his DC-based record label, ChuckLife 47 Productions, in 1997. Among the first people to be signed to the label were Tom Boi and Frankie;

WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson served as a mentor to upcoming producers such as Young
Guru and Rich Harrison;

- WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson returned to go-go music, producing three albums for his
 early mentor, Chuck Brown, and tracks for Rare Essence;
- 53 WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson, upon his death, was working on creating more music and 54 a documentary about his history with go-go music;

55 WHEREAS, on August 9, 2021, Chucky Thompson passed away in Los Angeles after 56 battling complications of COVID-19, leaving a legacy of kindness, creativity, and world-class 57 music; and

58 WHEREAS, Chucky Thompson leaves many loved ones to cherish his memory, including 59 his five children, Ashley, Emille, Myles, Quincey, and Trey Thompson; his grandchild, Brooklyn; 60 his mother, Charlotte; his two sisters, Chrystal and Carla; and many more friends, family, and fans 61 in the District and in the music community that he helped nurture.
