On Wednesday, November 10, 2021, Councilmember Kenyan R. McDuffie, Chairperson of the Committee on Business and Economic Development, will hold a public roundtable to consider the following measures:

- PR24-0444, the "Friendship Public Charter School, Inc. Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021"
- PR24-0445, the "D.C. Preparatory Academy Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021"
- PR24-0446, the "WHC Huntwood Courts Apartments LLC/WHC Huntwood LLC Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021"

PR24-0444, the "Friendship Public Charter School, Inc. Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021", would approve the issuance of up to \$20 million in District of Columbia revenue bonds to assist Friendship Public Charter School, Inc. with its costs associated with the renovation of its Lamond Campus in Northeast Washington, D.C.; the installation of an elevator system at its Blow Pierce Campus in Northeast Washington, D.C.; and the capital improvements and educational supports of several of its other campuses across Washington, D.C.

PR24-0445, the "D.C. Preparatory Academy Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021", would approve the issuance of up to \$55 million in District of Columbia revenue bonds to help D.C. Preparatory refund \$5.5 million in revenue bonds from 2005; refund \$9.58 million in revenue bonds from 2007; refinance the costs of improvements made to its Benning campuses; and acquire, construct, and equip its Anacostia Middle School campus located at 2330 Pomeroy Road, S.E., among other eligible expenses.

PR24-0446, the "WHC Huntwood Courts Apartments LLC/WHC Huntwood LLC Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2021", would approve the issuance of up to \$7.5 million in District of Columbia revenue bonds to facilitate the purchase of the Huntwood Courts Apartments at 5000 Hunt Street, N.E., and provision of 214 affordable rental housing units. The WHC is a non-profit that acquires and owns real estate for the creation and preservation of affordable housing as part of the larger Washington Housing Initiative.

The Committee invites the public to testify remotely or to submit written testimony.
