The Committee invites the public to provide oral and written testimony. Public witnesses seeking to provide oral testimony at the Committee's roundtable must thoroughly review the following instructions:

- Anyone wishing to provide oral testimony must email the Committee at <u>judiciary@dccouncil.us</u> with their name, telephone number, organizational affiliation, and title (if any), by the <u>close of business on Friday, November 26.</u>
- The Committee will approve witnesses' registrations based on the total time allotted for public testimony. The Committee will also determine the order of witnesses' testimony.
- Representatives of organizations will be allowed a maximum of five minutes for oral testimony, and individuals (and any subsequent representatives of the same organizations) will be allowed a maximum of three minutes.
- Witnesses are not permitted to yield their time to, or substitute their testimony for, the testimony of another individual or organization.
- If possible, witnesses should submit a copy of their testimony electronically in advance to judiciary@dccouncil.us.
- Witnesses who anticipate needing language interpretation are requested to inform the Committee as soon as possible. The Committee will make every effort to fulfill timely requests.

For witnesses who are unable to testify at the roundtable, written statements will be made part of the official record. Copies of written statements should be submitted to the Committee at judiciary@dccouncil.us. The record will close at the end of the business day on Friday, December 10.
