A RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve Contract No. NFPHC-RSK-22-C-00030 between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation commonly known as United Medical Center (“Hospital”), and Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company for the provision of workers’ compensation insurance coverage, and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under the Contract.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Contract No. NFPHC-RSK-22-C-00030 with Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2021”.

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve Contract No. NFPHC-RSK-22-C-00030 (“Contract”) between the Not-for-Profit Hospital Corporation (“NFPHC” or “Hospital”) and Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company, to provide workers’ compensation insurance to the Hospital and to authorize payment for the services received and to be received under this Contract.

36 (b) The proposed Contract seeks to provide workers' compensation insurance
37 coverage for the Hospital for the period, November 23, 2021 to November 23, 2022, in
38 the amount of \$1,402,120.00.

39 (d) Through discussions with its broker and Berkshire Hathaway Homestate
40 Companies, the parent entity of Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company, NFPHC
41 was able to secure a slightly lowered premium amount. But for the additional time taken
42 to ensure maximum contract value for NFPHC, the proposed Contract would have been
43 timely transmitted to Council.

44 (e) Emergency approval of this Contract for a total value of \$1,402,120.00 is
45 necessary to prevent any impact to the Hospital's workers' compensation insurance

46 (f) This Contract has an aggregate value that exceeds \$1 million in a 12-month
47 period, and therefore Council approval is necessary.

48 (g) Without this approval, Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company
49 cannot be paid for these critical services provided and to be provided in excess of
50 \$999,999.99.

51 Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2
52 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Contract No. NFPHC-
53 RSK-22-C-00030 with Redwood Fire and Casualty Insurance Company Approval and
54 Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2021 be adopted after a single reading.

55 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
