25	See 2 (a) Desire the archite health answer and the Marson and the Demonter of Health
26	Sec. 2. (a) During the public health emergency, the Mayor and the Department of Health
27	waived some licensure requirements under Department of Health Administrative Order 2020-02
28	("Order 2020-02") that allowed healthcare providers the flexibility to increase their staffing with
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29	healthcare professionals licensed outside of the District in order to ensure that District residents
30	had appropriate healthcare staffing.
31	(b) On July 25, 2021, the Mayor did not renew the public health emergency, and Order
32	2020-02 expired 60 days after the expiration of the public health emergency on September 23,

33 2021. But healthcare providers were finding significant wait times for District licensure
34 application approvals that went beyond the 60 days.

(c) In October of this year, the Council enacted the Preserve Our Healthcare Workforce
Emergency Amendment Act of 2021, effective October 25, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-189; 68 DCR
11343) ("emergency legislation"), to allow qualified volunteer health care professionals and
licensed health care providers to practice in the District without a District license until August
10, 2022 remedied the above-referenced issues. The emergency legislation expires on December
21, 2021.

(d) Temporary legislation, the Preserve Our Healthcare Workforce Temporary
Amendment Act of 2021, passed on 2nd reading on November 2, 2021 (Enrolled version of Bill
24-400), must still complete the 30-day review period required by section 602(c)(1) of the
District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official
Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and will not become law until after the expiration of the emergency
legislation

47 (e) It is important that the provisions of the emergency legislation continue in effect,48 without interruption, until the temporary legislation is in effect.

Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute
emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Preserve Our Healthcare Workforce
Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2021 be adopted after a single reading.
Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

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
