20 21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
22	act may be cited as the "Public Health Emergency Extension Emergency Amendment Act of
23	2022".
24	Sec. 2. Section 7 of the District of Columbia Public Emergency Act of 1980, effective
25	March 5, 1981 (D.C. Law 3-149; D.C. Official Code § 7-2306), is amended by adding a new
26	subsection (c-2) to read as follows:
27	"(c-2) Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c) of this section, the Council authorizes the
28	Mayor to extend the 15-day January 11, 2022, emergency executive order (Mayor's Order 2022-
29	008) issued in response to Healthcare Capacity until March 17, 2022. After the extension
30	authorized by this subsection, the Mayor may extend the emergency order for additional 15-day
31	periods pursuant to subsection (b) or (c) of this section.".
32	Sec. 3. Effective date.
33	This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
34	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than

- 35 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
- 36 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
- 37 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
