Council Chairman Phil Mendelson announces the scheduling of a public oversight roundtable of the Committee of the Whole on the implementation of Law 22-307, the Short-Term Rental Regulation Act of 2018. The roundtable will be held on **Tuesday, January 25, 2022 at 12:00 p.m. via Zoom Video Broadcast**.

D.C. Law 22-307, effective as of October 2019, requires the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) to license, monitor, and investigate short-term rentals in the District. Under the law, short-term rental hosts must apply for a short-term rental or vacation rental license endorsement and adhere to prescribed safety and record keeping standards. Platforms such as Airbnb and VRBO must submit monthly reports to DCRA for enforcement purposes, collect and remit all required transient occupancy taxes, and maintain all records for two years, in addition to other requirements. Final regulations for D.C. Law 22-307 were published in the D.C. Register on December 3, 2021, and DCRA will begin accepting short-term rental license applications on January 10, 2022. This roundtable will address the roll out of DCRA's licensing system, interpretation of the regulations, and initial implementation challenges.
