21	Sec. 2. Section 5(b)(2) of the District of Columbia Public Emergency Act of 1980, effective
22	March 5, 1981 (D.C. Law 3-149; D.C. Official Code § 7-2304(b) is amended by striking the phrase
23	"District of Columbia government;" and inserting the phrase "District of Columbia government;
24	provided further, that, with respect to the public health emergency and public emergency declared in
25	the Mayor's order dated March 11, 2020, and any extensions of either, or any newly declared public
26	emergencies in 2022, the additional authority provided pursuant to this paragraph for entering into
27	contracts and incurring obligations is limited to procurements that:
28	"(A) Are necessary to protect public health and safety through:
29	"(i) Coronavirus testing, including the necessary supports for testing such as
30	staffing, equipment, and supplies;
31	"(ii) Vaccination against COVID-19, including the necessary supports for
32	vaccination such as staffing, equipment, and supplies;

33	"(iii) Updating and maintaining information technology systems that support
34	the District's response to COVID-19, including the necessary supports for such updates and
35	maintenance; or,
36	"(iv) Provisions of masks and personal protective equipment; and,
37	"(B) Are entered into after a summary of each proposed procurement is provided to
38	the Council and made publicly available online that includes:
39	"(i) A description of the specific goods or services to be procured;
40	"(ii) The source selection method, including whether the procurement was
41	competitively sourced;
42	"(iii) The contract amount and the source of funds, whether federal or local;
43	"(iv) The name and certified business enterprise status of the proposed
44	awardee; and
45	"(v) An explanation regarding why expedited procurement procedures are
