15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
16	act may be cited as the "COVID Vaccination Leave Congressional Review Emergency
17	Declaration Resolution of 2022".
18	Sec. 2. (a) On November 2, 2021, the Council passed and on November 18, 2021, the
19	Mayor signed the "COVID Vaccination Leave Emergency Amendment Act of 2021," effective
20	November 18, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-209; 68 DCR 12355), ("emergency act") which will expire on
21	February 3, 2021.
22	(b) On December 7, 2021, the Council passed, on second reading, and on December 22,
23	2021, the Mayor signed, the "COVID Vaccination Leave Temporary Amendment Act of 2021,"
24	enacted December 22, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-255; 68 DCR 14074) ("temporary act"), which is
25	projected to become law on February 18, 2022.

- (c) This emergency legislation is necessary to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the effective date of the temporary act.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the COVID Vaccination Leave Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2022 be adopted after a single reading.
 - Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
