15	To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need
16	to amend the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Initiative of 1999 to

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
20	resolution may be cited as the "Medical Marijuana Plant Count Elimination Congressional
21	Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022".

24	("plant count limit") to 1,000 before the Council repealed the plant count limit on an emergency

- 35 (d) The emergency legislation expires on January 23, 2022, and the temporary legislation,
- which is completing congressional review, is not projected to become law until February 2,

- 38 (e) There exists an immediate need to enact emergency legislation to maintain the repeal
- of the arbitrary limit on the number of plants that a marijuana cultivation center may grow,
- 40 without interruption, until the temporary legislation is law.
