10	IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

15	To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need
16	to amend the Condominium Act of 1976 to authorize condominium unit owners'
17	associations to conduct virtual meetings and to clarify voting and quorum requirements
18	for such meetings; to amend the Coronavirus Support Temporary Amendment Act of
19	2021 to clarify when utility companies must consider a customer as certified as qualified
20	for utility disconnection relief, to require utility companies to provide monthly data on
21	the number of payment plans in default, and to clarify that the Office of the People's
22	Counsel ("OPC") has 2 business days to provide notice to a utility company of a
23	customer's request for OPC to negotiate a payment plan on their behalf; to amend the
24	Sustainable Solid Waste Management Amendment Act of 2014 to permit the Mayor to
25	administer virtual compost training; to amend the Open Meetings Act to provide that, for
26	the period of time from March 11, 2020, until December 31, 2022, a meeting shall be
27	deemed open to the public if the public body takes steps reasonably calculated to allow
28	the public to view or hear the meeting while the meeting is taking place, or, if doing so is
29	not technologically feasible, as soon thereafter as reasonably practicable; to amend the
30	Public Emergency Extension and Eviction and Utility Moratorium Phasing Temporary
31	Amendment Act of 2021 to repeal provisions that are no longer necessary; and to set
32	standards for operators of third-party food platforms for the setting of commission fees
33	and compensation rates for delivery service drivers.

35	RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
36	resolution may be cited as the "Post-Public Health Emergency Protections Extension
37	Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022".

- Sec. 2. (a) On October 5, 2021, the Council passed the Post-Public Health Emergency
- 39 Protections Extension Emergency Act of 2021, effective October 25, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-181; 68
- 40 DCR 11320) ("emergency act"), which expires on January 23, 2022.
- 41 (b) On November 2, 2021, the Council passed the Post-Public Health Emergency
- 42 Protections Extension Temporary Act of 2021, enacted on November 18, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-217;
- 43 68 DCR 12375) ("temporary act"), which is undergoing congressional review and has a projected
- law date of February 2, 2022.
- 45 (c) This emergency legislation is necessary to prevent a gap in the law between the
- expiration of the emergency act and the effective date of the temporary act.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
- 48 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Post-
- 49 Public Health Emergency Protections Congressional Review Emergency Act of 2022 be adopted
- 50 after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
