For the purposes of the act, the term: (1) "DCPS" means District of Columbia Public Schools. (2) "School" means a school in the DCPS system or an individual public charter school. Sec. 3. Classroom notification. (a)(1) Within 24 hours after a confirmed COVID-19 case of a student attending in-person learning or a school employee assigned to a classroom, a school shall send notice to all parents or guardians of students in the affected classroom and to all school personnel known to have spent at least one 15-minute period in the prior 3 days in the same classroom as the student or school 

employee. The notice shall disclose the fact of a positive test in the classroom and provide 34 information on COVID-19 testing location. 35 36 (2) The notifications required by subsection (a)(1) of this section shall be 37 electronic and through the preferred method of contact asserted by a student's parent or guardian, 38 if one has been asserted. 39 Sec. 4. COVID surge reporting requirements. 40 (a) Within 2 business days after the effective date of the Returning to School Safely 41 Emergency Act of 2022, passed on emergency basis January 18, 2022 (B24-XXX), and weekly 42 thereafter, DCPS shall transmit to the Council and post on the DCPS website the following information: 43 (1) The names of schools that have not been assigned a COVID Strategy & 44 45 Logistics Coordinator and the names of schools that have not been assigned a full-time substitute teacher as of that date and 46 47 (2) The percentage of asymptomatic testing completed in each school the preceding week. 48 49 Sec. 5.
