I write to request that the following measures be placed on the agenda for the February 1, 2022, Legislative Meeting:

#### Emergency Measures

- Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking Emergency Powers Authority Extension Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2022
- Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking Emergency Powers Authority Extension Emergency Act of 2022
- Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking Emergency Powers Authority Extension Temporary Act of 2022

The emergency authority granted to DISB's Commissioner to issue emergency rules, orders, and bulletins under section 5a(a) of the Department of Insurance and Securities Regulation Establishment Act of 1996, effective November 5, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-205; 68 DCR 012186) will expire on February 3, 2022, while the Mayor's public emergency will remain in effect. While the Council did also pass the Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking Temporary Act of 2021 (D.C. 24-256; 68 DCR 014080), that authority is currently tied to the Coronavirus Support Temporary Amendment Act of 2021 (D.C. Law 24-9; D.C. Official Code § 31-104.01), which expires on February 4, 2022. It is crucial that the Commissioner's emergency powers be amended to coincide with the public emergency declared by the Mayor to, among other things, address the immediate need to continue requiring insurers to cover widespread COVID-19 testing for in-person work and learning and any similar circumstances giving rise to the existence of a public emergency in the future. Without this authority, the Commissioner will not be able to require insurers to fully cover the cost of COVID-19 testing, which will make testing more costly for individuals and businesses and run the risk of discouraging testing as the ebbs and flows of COVID-19 surges and variants continue.
