Sec. 2. Section 2032(1) of the Deputy M	layor for Planning and Economic Development
Limited Grant-Making Authority Act of 2012,	effective September 12, 2012 (D.C. Law 19-168;
D.C. Official Code § 1-328.04(1)), is amended	to read as follows:
"(l)(1) Notwithstanding the Grant Admi	nistration Act of 2013, effective December 24,
2013 (D.C. Law 20-61; D.C. Official Code§ 1-	328.11 et seq.), and subject to the availability of
funds, the Deputy Mayor shall establish a COV	ID-19 Business Relief Grant Program ("BRG
Program") for the purpose of supporting the rec	opening, recovery, and long-term viability of the
businesses operating in the restaurant, retail, ho	ospitality, and entertainment sectors that have
incurred revenue declines, costs, or financial lo	sses due to the impact of COVID-19.
"(2)(A) To be eligible for a BRC	G Program grant, a business shall:
"(i) Be physically	v located in the District;

32	"(ii)(I) Have operated continuously since at least December 31,
33	2019, except for any interruptions required by Mayor's Orders 2020-045 and 2020-046 and
34	subsequent public health emergency orders; or
35	"(II) Have begun operating between January 1, 2020, and
36	December 31, 2021, and remained in operation except for any interruptions required by Mayor's
37	Orders 2020-045 and 2020-046 and subsequent public health emergency orders;
38	"(iii) Be in good standing with the District of Columbia's Office of
