A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To direct, on an emergency basis, the Mayor to propose a supplemental budget request and to 1 declare the sense of the Council in support of using supplemental funds available from 2 the fiscal year 2021 surplus or additional fiscal year 2022 revenues as may be necessary 3 to issue high-quality masks to students and school staff, to provide temporary premium 4 pay for substitute teachers and other hard-to-fill school staff, to improve and repair 5 HVAC systems if necessary, to provide temporary covid leave benefits for District 6 employees, and to offer additional emergency rental and utility assistance, and on related 7 matters. 8 9 RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Omicron Response and Fiscal Year 2022 Supplemental Budget 10 Emergency Resolution of 2022". 11 Sec. 2. (a) Pursuant to section 442(d) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, 12 approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 798; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.42(d)) and this 13 resolution, the Mayor shall prepare and submit to the Council a supplemental budget 14 recommendation for Fiscal Year 2022 by March 16, 2022. 15 (b) The supplemental budget request shall include the information set forth in section 4 of 16 the Fiscal Year Budget Submission Requirements Resolution of 2021, effective December 24, 17 2021 (Res. 24-311; 68 DCR 13776). 18

19	Sec. 3. It is the sense of the Council that:
20	(a) The supplemental budget request should fund the following one-time expenditures:
21	(1) High-quality, well-fitting masks or respirators that provide greater protection
22	than cloth or surgical masks issued to students and staff of public schools and public charter
23	schools providing in-person instruction;
24	(2) Temporary premium pay for school-based staff in hard-to-fill positions such
25	as substitute teachers;
26	(3) The enhancement, maintenance, replacement, or repair of heating, ventilation,
27	and air conditioning systems as may be necessary to reduce the risk of transmission of
28	COVID-19 inside school facilities, office buildings, correctional facilities, or other indoor spaces
29	owned or occupied by the District;
30	(4) Temporary supplemental sick leave or personal pandemic leave for District
31	employees who are unable to work during a period of quarantine or isolation or while providing
32	care for family members who must quarantine or isolate; provided, that the availability of such
33	supplemental sick leave may be restricted to employees who do not have accrued sick leave or
34	access to banked leave in sufficient amounts; and
35	(5) Emergency rental assistance and utility assistance to prevent evictions and
36	utility shutoffs;
37	(b) To the extent that resources are appropriated in the revised budget for Fiscal Year
38	2022 to support the expenditures listed in subsection (a) of this section, the Mayor may, instead
39	of including such expenditures in the supplemental budget request, concurrently submit to the
40	Council a document identifying the applicable funding source and amount or, with respect to

- subsection (a)(3), certifying the proper functioning of adequate HVAC systems in all District buildings;
- (c) It is appropriate to pay for this supplemental budget request from the Fiscal Year 2021

 General Fund surplus or from additional Local revenues that have been certified by the Chief

 Financial Officer for collection in Fiscal Year 2022;
 - (d) The issuance of high-quality, well-fitting masks to students and school staff and the proper functioning of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems will complement the other measures instituted at the direction of the Mayor and Chancellor to support in-person instruction;
 - (e) The Council supports the initiative of the Mayor and Chancellor to develop and launch a forthcoming test-to-stay program for District of Columbia Public Schools, and the Council encourages this program to be applied broadly to all students, teachers, and staff on a weekly basis or at such other intervals as may be appropriate for future levels of community spread;
 - (f) The Council expects the Mayor and Chancellor to comply with all District laws, including the legal requirement of classroom-based notifications following positive tests in schools, as set forth in section 104 of the Protecting Our Children Emergency Amendment Act of 2021, effective October 25, 2021 (D.C. Act 24-190; D.C. Official Code § 38-971.04) and reiterated in section 2 of the Returning to School Safely Emergency Act of 2022, passed by the Council on January 18, 2022 (enrolled version of Bill 24-611);
- 61 (g) The Council welcomes the actions taken by the Mayor and Interim Director of Human 62 Resources in promulgating DPM Issuance No. 2022-2, effective December 1, 2021, and the

63	Council supports expanding the availability of personal pandemic leave to employees who must
64	quarantine or care for family members;

- (h) The Council applauds the Mayor's efforts to request and partially obtain additional federal funds for emergency rental and utility assistance, and the Council further supports the use of additional District funds to prevent evictions and shutoffs; and
- (i) Consistent with recent budget practice, the Council anticipates receiving a supplemental budget request for the current fiscal year at the same time as the Mayor's proposed budget for the next fiscal year, and this resolution is not intended to preclude the Mayor's supplemental budget request from funding additional expenditures.
- Sec. 4. The Secretary to the Council shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer.
- Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
